THE NAMES PUBLISHED.

The Newmarket Express complains, and we think not without reason, of the frequent changes of the Education Department relative to the examinations. 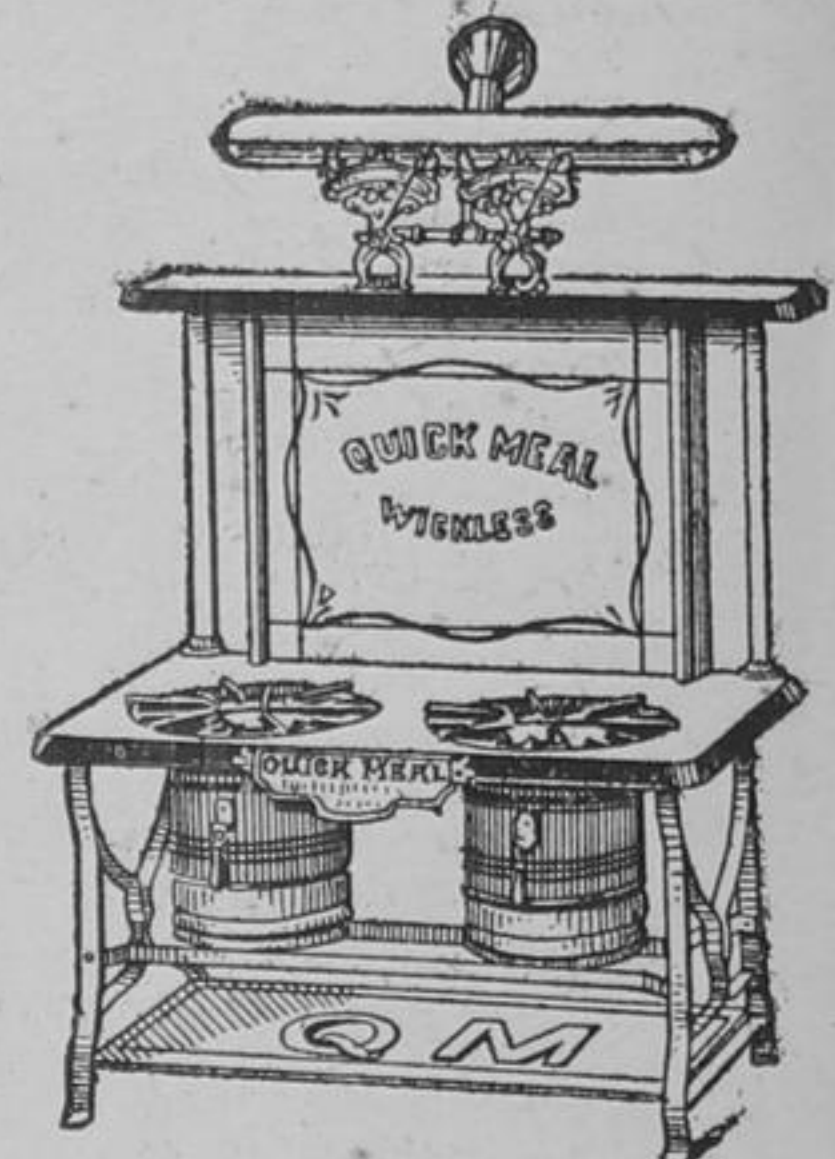

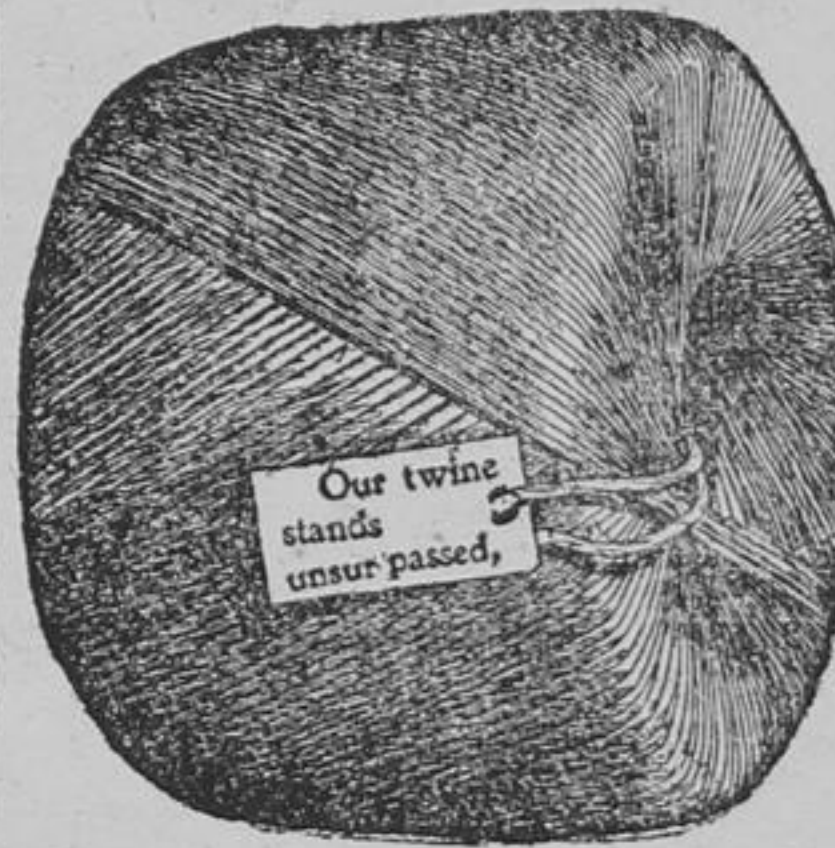
