**THE CROPS.**

The August report of the Ontario Bureau of Industries, issued by the Minister of Agriculture, regarding the crops of Ontario, is very encouraging, and shows that on the whole the crops throughout the Province are considerably above the average.

Commencing with fall wheat, the yield is good, notwithstanding the losses sustained by winter-killing in several localities. The yield of spring wheat will be in excess of the average. Barley as a rule has been good, although discolored in some places owing to recent rains. The oat crop is a large one, the reports being favorable from nearly every county. The reports as to the rye crop are almost uniformly favorable, and the yield per acre will be above the average and generally of good quality. Peas have not been sown in large quantities on account of the bug, but where the crop has been harvested the estimates are decidedly encouraging. The season has been a favorable one for beans, and the limited acreage devoted to their growth will make a better showing than the average. The hay and clover crop is a variable one, and on the whole is not satisfactory. The prospects for corn is good, except in the extreme eastern part of the province. There will be a good yield of potatoes, especially the late planted varieties, and all classes of roots at the time of reporting gave promise of being of fair quality.

If any person has doubts as to whether Canada is going ahead with leaps and bounds, let him consult the trade and commerce returns which are issued every year. Those blue books show that in 1867, when Confederation was formed, the British and foreign trade of the country was about \$130,000,000. In 1896, or twenty-nine years afterwards, the trade had increased to \$239,000,000, and the 1900 returns show the trade returns to be \$372,000,000. In other words the increase during the last four years has been greater than the previous twenty-nine. This is a showing of which any country has reason to be proud.

Bresci has been found guilty of the murder of King Humbert of Italy. As he was tried for wilful murder he will be placed in solitary confinement for the remainder of his life, in accordance with the laws of that country. Had the charge been treason, he would have suffered death, which is not considered so severe as that of life imprisonment in a dungeon.

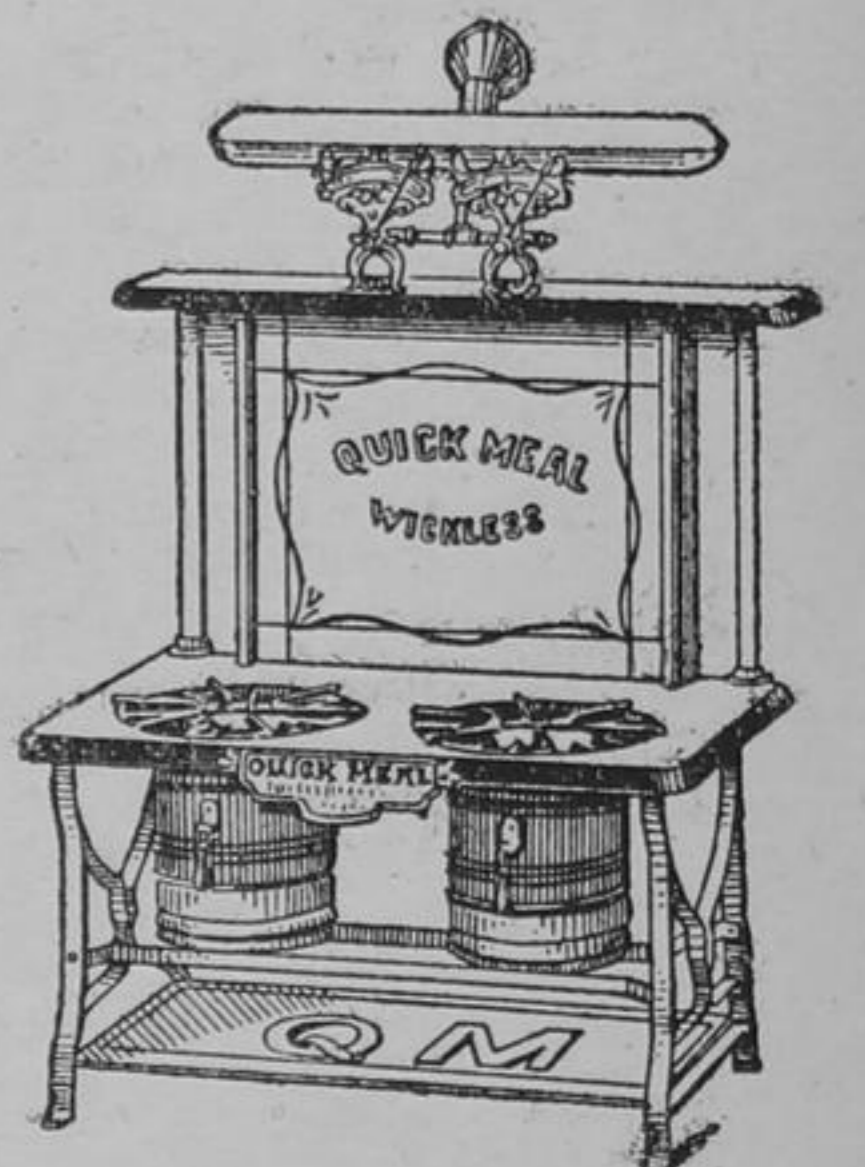

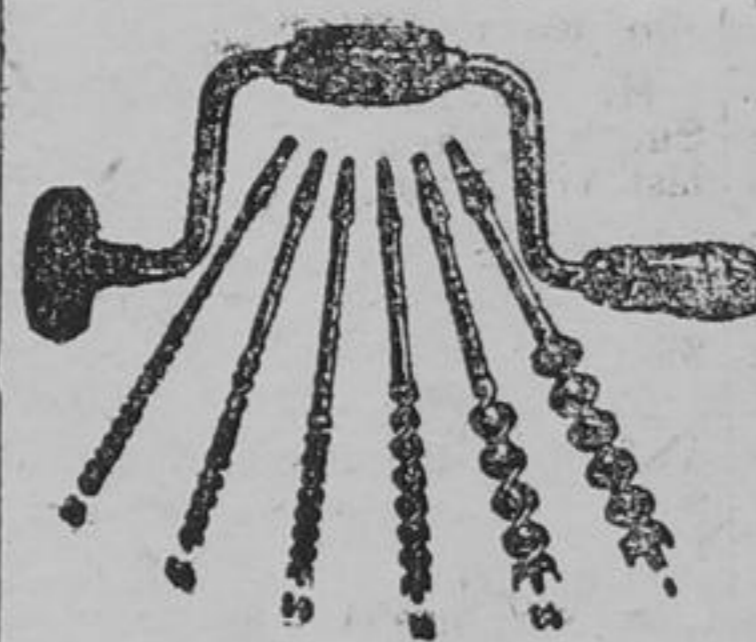
