Council met at Victoria Hall, Union-
ville, Feb'y 19.
Members present: Messrs. Dimma,
Eckardt, Summerfeldt, Sisley and
Morrison.
Reeve Dimma in the chair.
Minutes of last meeting read and
adopted.

A resolution by Messrs. Summer-
feldt and Eckardt was adopted relative
to the death of the late Queen Victoria,
and expressing loyalty to the new
king.

Mr. Morrison introduced a by-law
to borrow money to meet current ex-
penses, which was read three times
and passed.

take road machine share to Fleury's
foundry, Aurora, and ascertain prob-
able cost of manufacturing new shares
and report at next meeting.—Carried.

Summerfeldt—Sisley—that as notice
has been given that certain privileges
would be asked for at the present
session of the Legislature by the Met-
ropolitan Railway, the Reeve, Council-
or Eckardt, and Messrs. D. James and
H. B. Schmidt be commissioners to
watch the interests of this municipali-
ty.—Carried.

Sisley—Summerfeldt—that Mr. A.
Quantz be appointed commissioner to
settle with Mr. J. C. Steele for road
planer purchased in June last.—
Carried.

The council adjourned to meet on
Tuesday, 19th March.

The Board adjourned.



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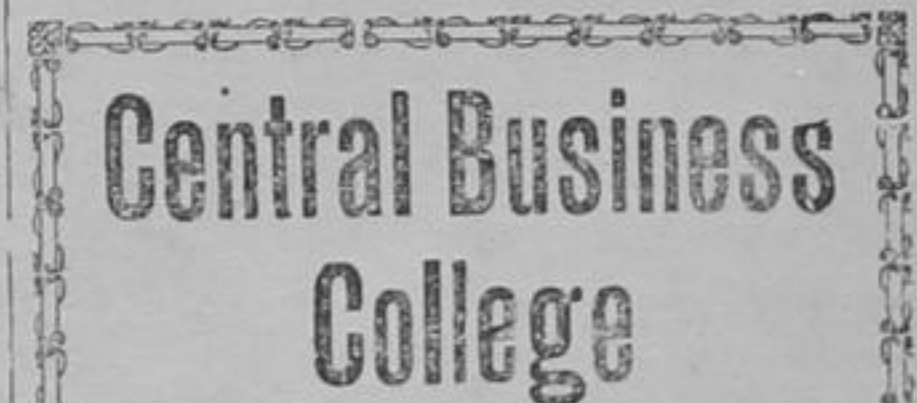
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
