TO TREAT CONSUMPTIVES.

An important conference was held in Ottawa this week for the purpose of discussing what practical steps can friends at Teston the fore part of this be taken to combat the dread disease of consumption and other forms of tuberculosis which are carrying off more of our people annually than all other contagious diseases put together. The meeting was presided office. over by the Governor-General and attended by representative men, on Sunday on the Twentieth Century medical and lay, from all over the Dominion. It was decided to form an association along the lines of that -recently organized in the Old Country under the presidency of the King, and a strong executive was elected. An active educational campaign will be at once entered upon in order that the people may realize that with proper care the disease may be prevented, or if not taken in time to be prevented, can be materially arrested; and in addition efforts will be made to secure means by public aid and private subscription to establish sanitoria all over the country.

The estimates brought down in Parliament a few days ago reveal a satisfactory condition of affairs, f r there is a decrease in capital account (for permanent works) of nearly \$4,-000,000, and in ordinary expenditure of over \$2,000,000. The public debt has been reduced over \$600,000. The principal decreases in ordinary expenditure are in public works, militia, railways and canals, and government of the North West, and the chief increases are in the post office, the administration of justice, and interest on the public debt. The big reduction in the capital account is in the amount asked for railways and canals.

In the course of a speech in the House one day last week the Premier explained with reference to the invalided soldiers returned from South Africa and the relatives of those who lost their lives there, that the Imperial authorities would make the same allowances as were made to the men of the regular army. What that would be was not yet known, but if the amount proved inadequate, he was satisfied Parliament would be prepared to supplement it by sufficient to bring it up to the Canadian standard.


