VACCINATE.

Whenever a case of smallpox breaks out in any village or town there is instantly a cry raised in favor of vaccination. But this is sometimes too late. It is like locking the stable door after the steed is stolen. The people possibly are not fully alive to the dangers which may surround them. Within the past few months several hundred cases of smallpox have existed in this province, which may result in a widespread epidemic. People are too much inclined to ignore personal danger, and pay more attention to the duties and pleasures of life. Would it not be well for Municipal Councils or Boards of Health to look into this important matter, and start an agitation in favor of vaccination.

It was pointed out at a political meeting held in the interest of Hon. E. J. Davis, in Newmarket, on Wednesday evening of last week, that of all the provinces Ontario was the only one that has no public debt, but on the contrary, has a handsome surplus. The other provinces, which started on the same terms as Ontario, 34 years ago, have all piled up a public debt-Quebec, \$35,450,548; British Columbia, \$7,425,262; Manitoba, \$5,701,850; Nova Scotia, \$3,-711,802; New Brunswick, \$3,198,-859; Prince Edward Island, \$468,-757. No one will contend that any of these provinces can vie with Ontario in her public institutions, her educational facilities, or the general prosperity and contentment of the people. In the matter of advancement, it is not too much to say that Ontario, with her cash surplus, can show three times the results that Quebec can, with her \$35,000,000 public debt. The management of Ontario's finances has been something more than prudent. It has been this year only. amazing in the extent of value that has been received for every dollar expended. Since Confederation the total revenue of the Province has been 108 million dollars, and the expenditure in that time a little over 107 millions. That is, the Governments which have held power in this Province have handled over \$215,-000,000 with never the suspicion of a scandal, and no loss whatever.

The news that the Dominion Goverument has set aside \$80,000 for the purchase of the historic battlefield, the Plaims of Abraham, near the City of Quebec, will be received with favor. The grounds which comprise over 70 acres are to be utilized as a public park, to forever mark the spot where two brave men, Wolfe and Montcalm, laid down their lives. The discussion on the subject in the House of Commons was calm, and the idea seemed to be, not to glorify the victory of the English over the French in their last battle on Candian soil, but to consecrate the ground on which men of both races died, and have it stand free from the pollution forever.

The Dominion Parliament has decided on establishing a Canadian mint. This new departure has been talked of for years, and the announcement at this time is being received with general satisafetion. Canadian gold, silver and bronze coin will be issued at Ottawa. The only opposers of the measure will be the banks, and it is thought that influence may be brought to bear against the bill when it goes before the Senate.

The Bill to increase the sessional indemnity from \$1,000 to \$1,500 for Members of the Parliament of Canada will probably not be popular, though it may prove to be a wise measure. There was very little opposition to the proposed increase from either of the political parties, and both the Premier and the Leader of the Opposition gave it their support. It was pointed out that the \$1,000 indemnity was provided when the sessions were expected to last only two months, whereas the sessions of late years are apt to run four and five months. To some people \$1,000 seems a large sum, but there are many men in Parliament who would make far more in their own business or profession. The increase should bring a better class of men into the field of politics, and for this reason it is hoped the country will approve of the measure.

Ontario has been fortunate in a long succession of Premiers who united to a remarkable extent the qualities of prudence and progressiveness. At the proper time, too, they were not wanting in aggressiveness. It will be a long time before Ontario will forget the splendid fight made by Sir Oliver Mowat and his Administration for Provincial rights. It is due to their efforts that all that vast district which we call New Ontario is still a part of our heritage. This region contains enormous mineral and pulpwood resources, and at least sixteen million acres of arable land, being more than was under cultivation in old Ontario last year. This great domain, bigger than some European kingdoms, was saved for Ontario by a watchful Government.

The following cablegram was sent from London on the 16th inst., which is considered a gracious act on the part of the new king,—"King Edward, who was born Nov. 8, 1841, has decided that his birthday shall be celebrated May 24 of each year, thus continuing the holiday hitherto observed by all the public departments—Queen Victoria's birthday—and giving an impetus to the colonial movement to observe the date as Empire Day." It has since been stated that the intimation referred to this year only.
