AN AWFUL RECORD.

Incidents during the past year in the lives of the three notorious bank burglars, Jones, Rutledge and Rice, go to show that the way of the transgressor is hard. Reports from detectives prove them to have been desperate characters for several years past, and during the last twelve months their record has been the blackest of the black. On the 22nd of May, 1900, they seem to have commenced their operations in Canada by gagging a night watchman, and breaking into the Standard Bank in Parkdale. The next night they visited Aurora, broke into Ross' private bank, the Post Office, and Wells' stables, and left for Chicago four days afterwards. The gang were arrested in Chicago on the 1st of June, and last April were handed over to the Canadian authorities. The jury disagreed in the Parkdale bank robbery case, and during the trial for the Aurora robberies, which seemed to be going against them, they committed a terrible tragedy in their endeavor to escape from the county constables, who were taking them from the court house to the jail, by shooting through the head Constable Boyd. They were re-captured and two days later Jones died from injuries received from the scuffle after having been shot through the arm by Constable Stewart. The two remaining criminals were found guilty of breaking into the Aurora bank, and pleaded guilty to the other charges, receiving as a sentence 21 years each. On the 7th of June Rutledge committed suicide by jumping from a gallery to the jail floor. Rice, the only survivor of the gang will be tried for the murder of Boyd with every probability of a conviction. It is to be hoped that Canada may never again be visited by such a band of desperadoes.

Although it has often been reported in Conservative papers that Sir Wilfrid Laurier was likely to leave Canada to accept a position in the Imperial Privy Council, there was never any reason to believe such a statement. The Premier made this clear a few days ago when he said in a public speech that he had no intention of doing such a thing. He would rather live and die in Canada, and wanted no greater honor than to be at the head of the Liberal party in this country.

The trade of Canada keeps steadily increasing. The aggregate for the eleven months up to the end of May amounted to \$329,352,721, as compared with \$308,548,034 for the same period of the previous fiscal year.

Lacrosse Notes.

The Toronto-Richmond Hill lacrosse match scheduled for Saturday, June 15, has been cancelled. The Young Toronto Lacrosse Club has disbanded on account of the action of the C. L. 
On Saturday last the Shamrocks of Montreal defeated the Torontos in lacrosse by a score of 4 to 1.
