At a general meeting of the above Association held on the 10th of October, it was resolved to issue a circular to the Dairymen of Canada, strongly advising them to turn their attention to butter more generally, and to discontinue the manufacture of cheese entirely after 1st November, for the following reasons:-

Butter should be shipped fresh weekly to command the best price. It is recommended that all factories should be fitted so as to make either cheese or butter. Cheese should be held three weeks at a temperature of 60° to ensure proper curing. Serious complaints continue to come of cheese made of much too thin wood.
