ANOTHER MEAN TRICK.

Something should be done in this village to stamp out the petty thieving. There is evidently a prevalent feeling that boys in their teens can take considerable latitude here, and commit mean tricks with impunity. It is a known fact that during the past few years many an offender has been allowed to go free because some one has pleaded in his behalf, while in other cases the sentences have been lightened by the pleadings of those who laid the charges. To fine or imprison our own citizens is often an unpleasant duty, but a sharp check now might save them a trip to Kingston in years to come.

King Edward has made a request that his birthday, November 9, be observed in Canada as a holiday. Little wonder is it that the Toronto dailies, Toronto merchants, and business men in other cities, are raising objections to the proposal. Thanksgiving Day will be observed in November, and it is argued that another holiday in the same month is unnecessary. There are doubtless too many holidays. They interfere with business and have a tendency to lighten men's pockets of ready cash. Canada is loyal to King Edward, and if our citizens are seen on the 9th of November with their everyday clothes on, it need not be taken as an indication of a lack of patriotism.
