### REPORT OF DIRECTORS.

The directors presented their annual report, as follows:

Your directors have the honor to present the report and financial statement of the company for the year which closed on December 31, 1901, duly vouched for by the audi-

The new business of the year consisted of 1,793 applications for insurance aggregating \$2,479,500, of which 1,704 applications, for \$2,-385,768.50, were accepted; applications for \$93,731.50 were rejected or held for further information.

As in previous years, the income of the company shows a gratifying increase, and the assets of the company have been increased by \$178,-581.66, and have now reached \$1,-449,925.58, exclusive of guarantee capital.

The security for policy-holders, including guarantee capital, amounted at the close of the year to \$2,319,-925.58, and the liabilities for reserves and all out-standing claims, \$1,290,840.94, showing a surplus of \$1,029,075.64. Exclusive of uncalled guarantee capital, the surplus to policy holders was \$159,075.64.

Policies on 56 lives became claims through death, to the amount of \$126,745, of which \$5,000 was reinsured in other companies, a rate of mortality considerably under that provided fer.

Including cash dividends and dividends applied to the reduction of premiums, \$30,638.70, with annuities, the total payments to policyholders amounted to \$182,925.67.


