#### TEMPERANCE ADDRESS.

Mr. John A. Nicholls, organizer for the Dominion Alliance, gave an interesting temperance address in the Temperance Hall on Thursday evening. The chair was filled by Mr. J. H. Sanderson, and devotional exercises were conducted by Ret. N. Wellwood. The audience was not large, and as is usually the case on similar occasions the ladies present were in the majority. Mr. Nicholls, in an able address, dealt with the question of temperance in a clear and forcible manner, giving a historical review of the prohibition movement in this country. He also referred to the present status of the question in Manitoba and our own province. Relative to the defeat of the temperance measure in Manitoba last week, the lecturer said it was due mainly to the action of the Dominion Alliance. 


