ELECTION FRAUDS.

Referring editorially to the Conservative candidate in East York, the Markham Sun last week said:

"If you wish to condemn the crookedness which has been practised at elections; if you believe that these crooks should be pursued and punished; if you believe in progressive, economical government, then Mr. Moyes has a claim for your support."

It is nonsense to say that Mr. Moyes and the Conservative party are more anxious to condemn crookedness at elections than Mr. Richardson and the Reform party are. Mr. Ross and his party have done everything possible to prevent election frauds, but unfortunately they have not always been supported by their opponents except when the alleged crimes have been committed by Liberals. More than a score of persons were convicted in the courts for crookedness since the last general election, and the Sun knows that these were not all on the one side of politics. Stringent measures have been passed by the Legislature, but electoral corruption will never be stamped out until the two political parties come to an honest agreement that such crimes must be punished wherever they are found.

Reports of Conservative speeches in various ridings show that the Ross Government are accused of being in league with the corporations, yet hundreds of people in York County heard Mr. Whitney say in Aurora a few weeks ago that if his party were successful in winning the coming elections he would repeal the present act by which insurance companies, loan companies, banks, &c., are taxed. The present law is a just one. If a farmer has to pay taxes on his farm, why has a capitalist who invests his money in a bank any right to be exempt from paying his share of the taxes necessary for the maintenance of good roads and our institutions. Mr. Whitney may find it difficult to run with the hare and bark with the hounds.
