QUESTION AND ANSWERS.

Mr. Arch. Campbell, M. P. for West York, has introduced a bill in the House of Commons to amend the Weights and Measures Act. The three sections are as follows :--

1. When milk is sold by the can, the can shall be considered as equivalent to eight gallons, and the half can to four gallons.
