GERMAN RAILROAD SPEED.

Rails and Ties Damaged by Speed in Electric Trials.

Several months have elapsed since the close of the experiments in highspeed electrical traction over the specially prepared railroad line between Berlin and Zossen. No official report of the results obtained has yet been printed. But from authentic sources some highly interesting information has been obtained.

It will be remembered that the purpose of the trials was to ascertain how high a rate of speed, by the use of electric power, might be practically and safely attained with the track and cars provided.
