Innes & Sons, and is a chedit to the firm. It is made from quarter cut white oak, neatly matched, and there is a plate glass door in front of dial and pendu lum. The clock chimes the Westminster chimes. It has brass movement, and all the pinions, arbors and racks are cut from Stubbs steel and tempered. The dial is made of hard rolled brass, and the figures are brass (Arabic pattern) and set in a circular recess.
