VICTORIA DAY IN RICHMOND HILL.

The Fair and Concert a
Great Success.

Notwithstanding the muddy roads
and the threatening appearance of the
clouds Saturday morning a large
crowd gathered in the forenoon, and
when the gates at the park were
opened in the afternoon a great num-
ber of people passed in to see the ex-
hibits, and spend an enjoyable after-
noon together. There were seven en-
tries for the football contest, and
some spirited games were played.
Locust Hill finally winning the \$16.50
cash prize. The Governor-General's
Body Guard Band gave an excellent
program in the afternoon, and proved
themselves a great musical attraction.
The merry-go-round also played its
familiar airs, and seemed to be well
patronized. The only disappointment
was in the speeding class. Owing to
the heavy rains the lower part of the
track was unfit for trotting races, and
there were no entries. Several good
horses were on the way to the Fair
but turned back owing to the circum-
stances which prevailed. There was a
fine display of horses, probably the
largest ever shown here. There were 9
entries in single carriage, and an
equal number in gentlemen's-turn-out.
The different classes in cattle were
well represented, as were also the
sheep and poultry classes. The entries
in the ladies' department were large,
and much of the work creditable. W.
Trench & Son had a good display
of waggons and carriages, and many
interested parties examined the cream
separators of Messrs Robinson &
Thomson, and Mr. T. H. Keys, of
