York County Council opened its
summer session in the Old Court House
on Monday, Warden Norman of King
in the chair. After a neat address by
the Warden the following communica-
tions were laid on the table:—

From Mayor Howland, re county
rooms in City Hall; C. D. Warren,
President of the Metropolitan Rail-
way Co., stating that four new cars
would be ready for use within 60 days,
and from John Millar, Deputy Minis-
ter of Education, giving the amounts of
grants to High Schools to be: Mark-
ham, \$688.82; Aurora, \$605.16;
Weston, \$484.09; Newmarket, \$637.34;
Richmond Hill, \$487.82; Toronto
Junction, \$943.78.

By the invitation of the Warden
the members of the Council, county

officials and a number of friends en-
joyed a trip across the Lake to
Niagara Falls on Tuesday.

The Treasurer reported a balance
in the bank of \$14,500, and \$150 was
ordered to be paid to the School Board
of Toronto Junction as the county's
share of the assessment for the years
1901 and 1902.
