brass used for ruby pin; jewels fastemed with shellac instead of being hearnished in ; broken mainsprings repaired by re-punching instead of throwing them away; temper drawn ftom pinions to pivot them; the new pivot eccentric with pinions, etc., etc.

After your watch meets with a few of such jobs, you will wonder why it don't keep time.

Cheap repairing on a good watch is money wasted. I dont try to compete for price; my aim is to excel in workmanship. A botch job is an eyesore to a good mechanic,

You might ask yourself the question, how am I to know what kind of work is done to my watch?-By the fruit we know the tree. I might add there have not been quite twenty d'plomas issued by the Canadian Horological Institute. Toronto, since it was founded in 1890. By this you can form some idea what perseverance it requires to "get there."

If I cant master the job you bring to me I will tell you so. Honesty is the policy on which I stand or fall.




