BOTCH WORK.

Did you ever think of the risk you run by not being careful with whom you leave your fine timepiece for repairs?

There are many good watchmakers in our Province, but "Botches" outnumber them many times over.

Quite frequently I find watches have brass used for ruby pin; jewels fastened with shellac instead of being furnished in; broken mainsprings repaired by re-punching instead of throwing them away; temper drawn from pinions to pivot them; the new pivot eccentric with pinions, etc., etc.

After your watch meets with a few of such jobs, you will wonder why it doesn't keep time.

Cheap repairing on a good watch is money wasted. I don't try to compete for price; my aim is to excel in workmanship. A botch job is an eye-sore to a good mechanic.

You might ask yourself the question, how am I to know what kind of work is done to my watch?—By the fruit we know the tree. I might add there have not been quite twenty diplomas issued by the Canadian Horological Institute, Toronto, since it was founded in 1890. By this you can form some idea what perseverance it requires to "get there."

If I can't master the job you bring to me I will tell you so. Honesty is the policy on which I stand or fall.

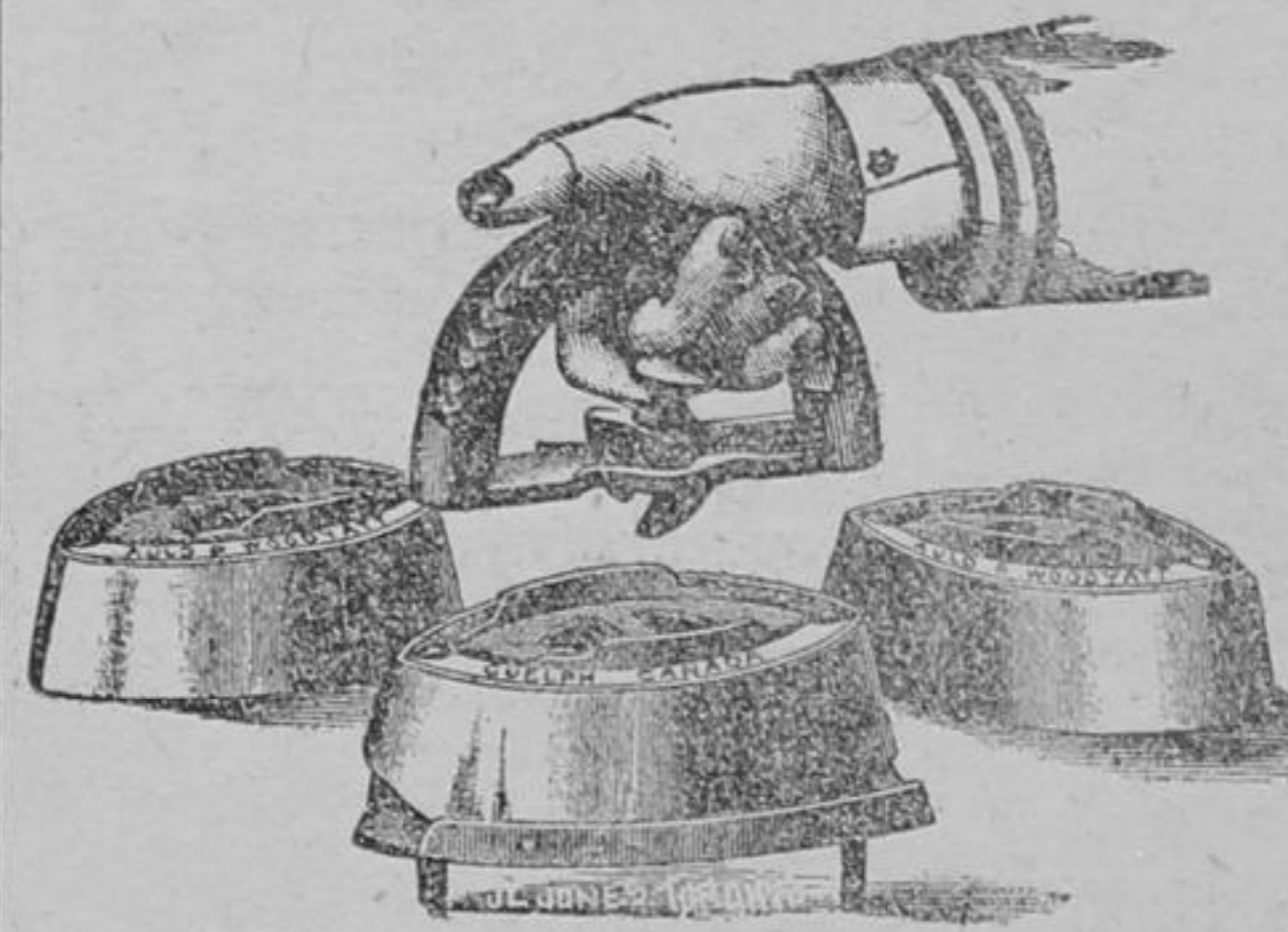

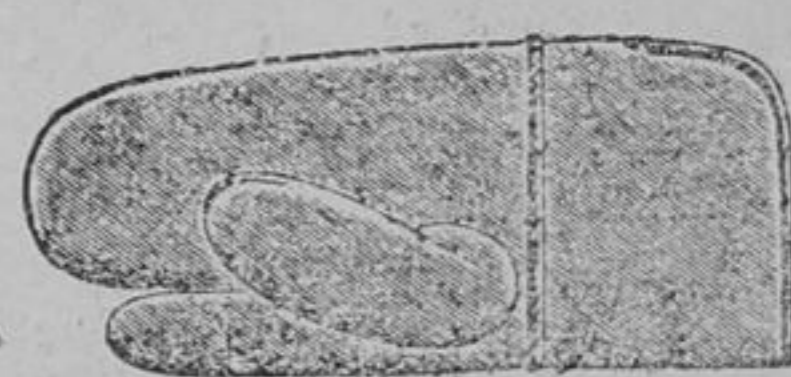
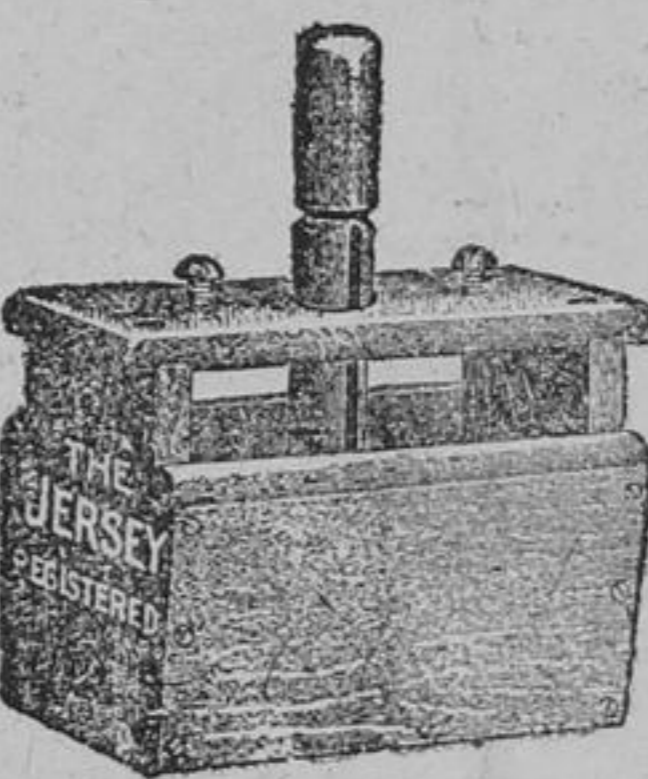
