

SECOND LARGEST ISLAND

Baffin Land Has Recently Been Coming Into Prominence.

Dr. Robert Bell, who in 1897, mapped a long stretch of the west coast of Baffin Land, has since been making further surveys of that territory, and now reports that the island is, at least, 300,000 square miles in area.

Three years ago no atlas or other publication enumerating the large islands of the world included Baffin Land among them. It had always been thought to be composed of a number of islands, and is still shown in this way on many maps.

The distinction of being the largest island has been held by quite a number of islands in the progress of geographical knowledge. For many years school children were taught that Australia was the largest island, then it was concluded to be better to enumerate Australia among the continental masses and Borneo took its place as the largest island.

ARMoured NESTS.

In the countries where the cactus flourishes, it is selected by various birds and other members of the animal kingdom as a place of refuge. There is a special kind of woodpecker in Mexico, a clever bird, which furnishes an illustration of what birds will do. If the traveller is near a mass of cactus known as the candle cactus, he will perceive, to some height from the ground, a hole in the mass of spiny leaves that appears to be evidence of decay.
