Shivering As a Cold Cure-Benefits of Sneezing-Reasons for Coughing.

Those everyday little physiological exercises which we go through, such as shivering, sneezing, yawning, crying, coughing, etc., seem nuisances to most of us. But when their purpose is understood it is quite apparent that we would have an exceedingly bad time in their absence.

Shivering is defined by the scient-Ists as a series of "irregular fibrillar contractions." We shiver, of course, when we are cold, but Nature does nothing without a purpose, and the purpose of shivering is to make us warm. Muscular contraction, in fact, produces heat, and shivering is nothing more than a violent contraction of all the little fibrils, or strands, of the muscles. If we could keep up the shivering long enough we would burst into a perspiration. What happens is that the skin says, "Oh, I'm so cold !" and the muscles take pity upon it and shiver to warm it.

### WHY DO WE SNEEZE ?


