TOOTHACHE AND SIGHT.

The Lancet cites another case of a woman, aged forty-five years, who complained of impaired vision in the right eye and a painful upper bicuspid. The offending tooth was removed and the sight was immediately restored.

Implicated in the affair were some of the most prominent business houses in the world, and a vast number of other persons were more or less interested in the verdict to say nothing of the anxiety of the principals.

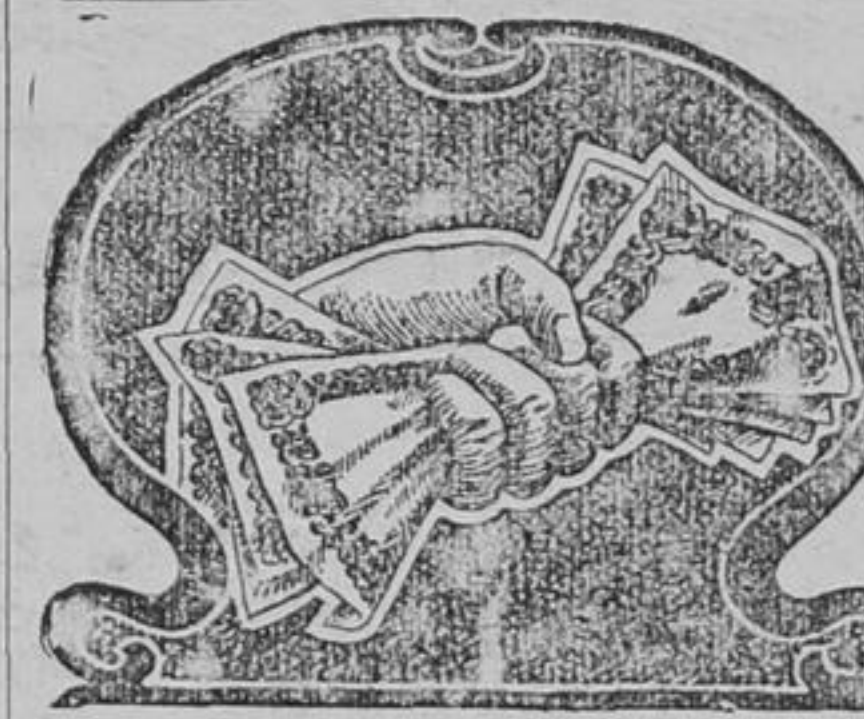
The jury was comprised of three members of the Provincial Council, three estate owners, a delegate of the Russian Government and three district agricultural inspectors.
