NORTH YORK.

On Tuesday in Newmarket, Hon. E. J. Davis gave his promised explanation to the Executive of North York Liberal association, relative to his reputed resignation, and the result, as might have been expected, was perfectly satisfactory to his Friends. Mr. Davis stated that several items which have occurred incertain Conservative papers, and some statements purported to have come from Mr. T. H. Lennox, relative to the settlement of the petition and cross-petition, were incorrect and misleading. It had been stated previous to the three recent bye elections that Mr. Davis had resigned, but a statement from Judge Morgan show ed that an agreement had been made between the parties concerned, but that Mr. Davis' resignation was to bear date the 20th of February. It is understood, therefore, that Mr. Davis will resign his seat in the Ontario Legislature, and that a new election will take place in the course of a few weeks. The Commissioner of Crown Lands declared that he had no reason to fear an exposure of corruption, but rather to avoid political bitterness, and, on his own account, to avoid the expense, which would possibly be from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Before the meeting closed a resolution was unanimously carried expressing the utmost confidence in their Local member, assuring him of continued loyalty, and promising every assistance to win a greater victory when the time comes. In his address Mr. Davis repeated the offer made in May last, expressing a desire to hold a series of joint meetings with Mr. Lennox when the electors would have an opportunity of hearing both candidates discuss the political questions of the day, from the same platform. A mass meeting will be held in the Town Hall, Newmarket, next Tuesday afternoon, when Mr.Davis will be re-nominated

The Premier of the Dominion is authority for the statement that there will be no reservations, that the whole territory in dispute will be considered. The new treaty prevides for the appointment of six jurists, three to represent the United States and three to represent Great Britain and Canada. The jurists have not yet been appointed, but it is likely that two of them will be British and one Canadian. It will not be surprising if there is a deadlock among the six jurists, but in that ease the important question will be submitted to another tribunal for final settlement.
