

HE picture shown is one dear to every man, woman, boy and girl, on account of its meaning-" The Victoria Cross," given for conspicuous bravery. If only the soil of South Africa could voice the deeds performed upon it, how many Victoria Crosses would have been found to have been earned by Canada's sons!
