The Renfrew poultry business received a great impetus on account of the operation of the illustration fattening station, the farmers are pleased with the increased returns received from their fatted chickens, and are in a good way to realize a substantial poultry revenue. What has been accomplished in Renfrew can be repeated in other parts of Canada.
