A REMARKABLE CAREER.

He was only twenty-one when he arst made acquaintance with Africa, which was afterwards to be his happy hunting-ground. Spending some time in Tunis, he mastered Arabic, and probed into the social and political problems of that romantic region. A series of articles on this subject attracted the attention of Lord Mayo, who was arranging a mission to Portuguese West Africa, and knowing that Johnston was familiar with the Portuguese language, he invited him to accompany the expedition. The young enthusiast accepted the offer, and upon the completion of the mission travelled on alone into the heart of the Congo, and tracked the great river of Central Africa through its tropical wanderings.

Returning home at the end of 1883, he produced a remarkable work dealing with the River Congo which brought him into notice, and was the means of his being selected to conduct an expedition to Kilimanfaro, in East Africa. Johnston's great energy and shrewd observadons won him the favor of Lord

Salisbury, and after he had recorded the results of the expedition in a new book, he was appointed in the autumn of 1885 as Vice-Consul to the Cameroons and Oil River. He was shortly promoted to be Chief Consul, and in this capacity took sole charge of the great territory now known as Southern Nigeria. After that came rapid promotion.
