To Oppose the Change.

The recent amendment by the Legislature to the Municipal Act, styled "section 68 a," changing the constitutions of County Councils, will be vigorously opposed by York County Council, as well as several other County Councils. York Council will petition the Legislature that any legislation changing the constitution of County Councils should be provided for by a uniform system, and this important matter should not be left in the control of the local muniprejudiced against County Councils.

In the County of York there are twenty local municipalities, being ten townships and ten towns and villages. The ten townships are equalized at \$24,249,459 and the ten towns and incorporated villages at \$2,613,375. Thus under the proposed system each County Councillor from a township would represent an average assessment, in round numbers, of \$2,500,000, while representatives of towns and villages would only repre- number of clergymen. sent \$26,000 of assessment.

On the other hand in any case where sub-section 8 of section 68 a, of the Consolidated Municipal Act of 1903 applies, the representative of the township would be able to entirely override the wishes of the town and village members of such Council.
