THE MAJORITY, THREE.

The budget debate in the Ontario Legislature closed Thursday night, several weeks having been taken up in the discussion. Mr. J. J. Foy and Mr. J. P. Whitney were the last speakers on the Opposition side, and Hon. J. M. Gibson spoke for the Government. Before closing Mr. Foy moved in amendment that "the House approved of the payment of the wages of the foremen, mechanics, laborers and other workmen at the 'Soo,' but it did not approve of the payment of the salaries of the higher officials."

Both Mr. Foy and Mr. Whitney admitted that in order to prevent much distress and probably bloodshed at the time the Clergue Works closed at the "Soo," the Government were justified in arranging for the payment of the wages of the workmen, but the Leader of the Opposition and his Lieutenant seemed to think that the Government were actuated by a desire to win the bye-election at that place more than to assist those in distress.

Hon. J. M. Gibson justified the Government's action in paying the wages of all the men, and showed that the Province was fully protected and could not lose anything by the transaction. All they did was to guarantee that the banks that advanced the money would be indemnified. Mr. Gibson showed that Mr. Whitney and Mr. Foy had approved of 94 per cent. of the payments, and took exception to only 6 per cent. In other words they approved of the payments to the amount of \$260,000, but they objected to the payment of the balance, \$16,000.

The vote was a straight party one, the Government having a majority of three. The vote stood 47 to 44, and there were three absentees on each side.
