**LOCAL OPTION.**

By all accounts local option in Toronto Junction seems likely to get well tested in that town. It is said that on the one hand the hotel-keepers have sent away their boarders, closed their houses to the public, and are making it as difficult as they can for travellers to get accommodation. On the other hand the temperance party and the Citizens' League are providing accommodation in various ways, and they say that travellers and citizens generally will not suffer by the recent change in the law. It is right that those who voted in favor of local option should now be "up and doing," and exerting themselves to find a solution for hotel accommodation. It too often happens that a temperance measure is carried by a substantial majority, then the voters settle down and expect Government officials or Municipal officers to see that the law is enforced. If it is important to carry a measure, it is of far greater importance to see that the measure is properly enforced. The temperance people of Toronto Junction realize this, and are evidently prepared to put their shoulder to the wheel. All good citizens should endeavor to give local option a fair trial even if they have to make some sacrifice.

It is to be hoped that the young farmers of this section of country will back up the County Fathers, and show by their keenness in coming forward that they appreciate the wisdom and patriotism of the County Council in providing quarters for the local squadrons.

**Cavalry Training**

The Annual Training at Niagara takes place on June 14th. The Gov. Gen. Body Guard wishes to recruit in this District, and names of those who wish to join the Regiment to be given at once to the gentleman below.

The training lasts 12 days. The rate of pay is 50c. a day and rations, increasing for good conduct and efficiency to \$1 a day. Horse pay \$1 a day and forage supplied. All those who could bring an extra horse for this pay (or any one who has a suitable horse to rent) communicate the fact at once to the gentleman whose name is below. Damage of horse up to \$50, or loss of horse up to \$100 paid by the Government, but horses are rarely hurt as they are well fed, and the best care taken of them.

Recruits should be over 18 years of age. Farmers, or farmer's sons, owning their own horses preferred.
