**A SUMMER SCHOOL FOR NATURE STUDY.**

The Macdonald Institute at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, will provide a Summer School for teachers during the coming vacation. The term will extend from July 5th to July 29th inclusive, and the work will consist of practical Nature Study, suitable for our public schools.

The classes will be under the direction of Dr. W. H. Withrow of the Macdonald Institute, and Professor William Lechhead of the Biological Department in the Ontario Agricultural College, assisted by teachers of special fitness in the various subjects of the course.

The Macdonald Institute is situated on the grounds of the Ontario Agricultural College about one mile from the city of Guelph and is reached by the electric street railway.

The course will be thoroughly practical, involving daily excursions, lectures and laboratory work, the preparation of Nature Study collections and courses of reading in illustration of the subjects discussed. A leaflet giving fuller information may be had by application to Dr. W. H. Withrow, Dean of the institute.

**Court of Revision**

Pursuant to published notice, a court was held in the council chamber on Monday, May 30, at 8 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of revising the assessment roll of the village of Richmond Hill for the current year. The reeve laid the assessment roll before the court and stated that there were no appeals.

After the court had examined the roll the following changes were ordered to be made, viz:—

- No. 195—A. Martin to be inserted as tenant of D. Reaman.
- No. 64—Amos J. Wright to be assessed instead of Wm. Gould.
- No. 95—Jesse Hodgins to be assessed for a dog.
- No. 201—The name of Jerry Smith to be entered instead of W. T. Storey, and adding thereto \$100 for personal property.
- No. 205—Albert Albin to be assessed as owner of property entered in name of Jerry Smith as tenant, less \$100 of tenant's personal property.
- Paulin—Glass—That the assessment roll be now passed as finally revised and corrected and that the Clerk is hereby instructed to certify the same, and it shall be valid and binding on all parties concerned, notwithstanding any defect or error committed in or with regard to the said roll.—Carried.

**CANADA CARTOONED.**

Mr. Arch. Campbell, M. P., has, during the past week or two, been sending some interesting literature to some of his constituents in this section. One of the pamphlets is a book of cartoons published by the authority of the Hon. Clifford Sifton, Minister of

the Interior. A number of the cartoons draw a comparison between Canada and the United States, showing the advantages in the former country, while others show that "John Bull" at last appreciates the worth and capacity of the greatest of his children. Probably the best cartoon in the pamphlet is the one entitled "The Only Drawback." In this Uncle Sam and John Bull are driving through the Canadian West, when the former remarked to the latter: "Well, they say its a fine looking country, John, but darn it all, you can't see it for the wheat." Another pamphlet is a geography of the Dominion, and Atlas of Western Canada.
