**MAKING THE FAIRS EDUCATIONAL.**

Three years ago when Mr. F. W. Hodson, Live Stock Commissioner, pointed out to the annual meeting of the Association of Fairs and Exhibitions the utter inefficiency of many of the agricultural societies of Ontario, and unfolded a systematic plan of improvement, he was looked upon by many of the delegates as a dangerous iconoclast. The fact that fairs which received government grants were intended to be educational seemed to be almost forgotten, and the proposal to arrange the fairs in convenient circuits and send them expert judges who would give educational addresses in the ring was considered impracticable by many. Still the project was taken up in an experimental way and the results have been so satisfactory that this year it is expected that about 170 agricultural societies in Ontario will arrange with the provincial Department of Agriculture for the services of expert judges. Last year 152 societies in that province were supplied with judges, while in the other provinces and the Territories many of the fairs had expert judges furnished by the local and Dominion Departments of Agriculture.

**LIBERALS ORGANIZING.**

So far as the Province of Ontario is concerned, Liberal members are urging their followers in each constituency to look carefully after the voters' lists of this year. There is no doubt the lists of 1904 will be the lists used in the next Dominion general election, and should Hon. George W. Ross, premier of Ontario, decide not to have a fourth session of the present parliament of Ontario, the lists of 1904 will be used in the next provincial general election.

James Vance, 34 Victoria St., Toronto, is in charge of the Central Liberal offices for the province, and Liberal workers are requested to write him for instructions, forms, etc., for use in the revision of the lists and naturalization of aliens.

Former Canadians, who have become subjects of a foreign country, can, on returning to Canada, be naturalized as British subjects in three months; the period for other aliens is three years.

The Central Liberal Association has not a staff of organizers, and the officers of the riding associations are making their own arrangements as to lists, organization and naturalization. In furnishing information from the head office Mr. Vance's time will be fully occupied, as he is the only person under the direction of the Ontario Liberal Association or Central office.

**The Father's Duty to the Militia.**

Complaints are being made on many sides that the farmer's sons are prevented by their fathers from joining the Militia. This should not be the case except in rare and exceptional instances. Instead of looking upon a wish to wear the King's Uniform as an evidence of undesirable tendencies on the part of the son, the father in most cases might well be glad that a wholesome and patriotic spirit should be exhibited by his son instead of a less worthy manner of obtaining his amusement and recreation.

Some men must be called upon to make sacrifices for the sake of their country. Many men have a convenient way of passing this on to their neighbors, selfishly excusing themselves on the plea of personal urgency. Should every man take the ground that soldiering in Canada is unnecessary, an organized force would be done away with and a disorganized mob would be all that could be relied

upon if our country was compelled to fight for its existence.

It is self-evident that labour is scarce and wages high, but it is at such times as these that the patriotic and self sacrificing Canadian father can contribute to his Country a gift of value when he says "all right my boy, I am glad to see the old spirit, which I felt myself, coming out again in my son. We are busy, but twelve days will soon be over, take your horse and be off to camp, behave yourself and be a credit to your name."

The County Council have set a noble example in establishing local headquarters for the the oldest mounted corps in Canada in our midst. The men and women of the County should back them up by sparing their boys for a few days once a year.
