FOR THE ELECTORS.

We have to thank Mr. George Taylor, M. P., for a four page sheet received through the post office, purporting to be the "Conservative Policy" for the next Dominion elections. But while thanking Mr. Taylor for the remembrance it can be no harm to point out that the average Grit can afford to smile as he reads the paragraphs which are intended to enlighten (?) the electors of this country. The campaign sheet calls upon the electors to "punish the Liberals for their sins," by turning them out of power and allowing the Conservatives to take their places.

"Instead of reducing taxation the Liberals have increased it." Surely with a surplus this year of over \$14,000,000 and a reduction in the national debt of \$7,500,000, the Liberals can be excused for expending more money than was spent in 1896.

It must be humiliating to honest Conservatives to read the document calling on the people to "vote for the Borden candidate" for the reasons given. The following are among the reasons:—"The Liberal Government has done nothing for Canada's progress. Its only memorable achievement is a vast increase in the national expenditure, and the collection of great taxation from the people. Its administrative record is a record of scandals and incompetence." On the other hand: "The Conservative party has a record of notable measures for Canada's development. It stands for the protection of Canadian industries, for more work and better wages for the Canadian workingman, and for economy of administration. It will pay you to put it in power."

The campaign sheet says that the Liberal tariff is not high enough, and clearly (?) states the Conservative policy to be "adequate protection," whatever that may mean.

The Ontario Government has passed an Order in Council preparatory to guaranteeing the bonds of the James Bay Railway Company to the extent of \$20,000 a mile from Toronto to Sudbury. It is provided that the construction of the Railway shall be commenced within one year, and shall be completed within three years from the first of next January.

The Provincial Fruit, Flower and Honey Show.

Great arrangements are being made for the Provincial Fruit, Flower and Honey Show it is proposed to hold in Toronto during the second week in November. It will be the biggest show of the kind ever held in Canada. The various Associations interested include the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association, the Ontario Bee Keepers' Association, the Toronto Horticultural Society, the Toronto Gardeners and Florists' Association and the Toronto Electoral District Society. The two rinks on Church Street have already been secured for the purpose of this exhibition. The fruit and honey exhibits will be shown in one rink, while the flowers will be on view in the second. A display of machinery and implements used in the cultivation of fruit and flowers will be made in an open piece of land between the two rinks. The prizes offered for the floral section alone amount to over \$1200. The prize list is already in circulation. The Fruit Growers will expend \$1000 in their part of the show. Honey has been reserved to provide for the collection of representative exhibits of fruit from all the Counties in the Province. The fruit will be kept in cold storage. It is expected to make this show rival in its way, the Provincial Winter Fair, held at Guelph. The management of this show will be largely in the hands of H. B. Cowan of Toronto, Provincial Superintendent of Agricultural Societies, to whom any requests for information may be sent.
