

RICHMOND HILL, June 22, 1905

Markham Council

Markham Township Council met 13th inst., Reeve Slater in the chair. All the members present.

Petitions for and against were presented relative to laying sidewalk through Mount Joy, to be paid for by frontage tax.

The clerk was instructed to have bills posted up notifying ratepayers in regard to noxious weeds.

John McPherson was given permission to place weigh scales at Ringwood.

Resolutions were passed ordering the payment of a number of accounts.

Mr. H. B. Schmidt addressed the Council relative to keeping culverts in proper repair on Markham and York townline.

The clerk was instructed to renew suit against Langstaff property.

The sum of \$75 was granted to the East York and Markham Agricultural Society.

The commissioners of Road Division No. 1 were instructed to clean out ditch, lot 15, con. 2, and lower culvert if necessary.

F. Pearson was appointed com. to build bridge on York townline, between 3rd and 4th cons., to act with York township com.

Win. Frisby was voted \$7 per day for use of engine and belt to operate road crusher and keep crusher in order, township to furnish oil.

As a Com. of Revision the Council reduced the assessment of the Toronto & York Radial Railway, 8 miles, from \$13,000 to \$10,000, Vaughan having made a similar assessment.

The clerk was instructed to take proceedings against the James Bay Railway to give the information required to assess their property.

The Council adjourned to meet Saturday, 24th inst., at 2 p. m., and at 3 p. m. as a Court of Revision.
