The running expenses of the country were increased Monday by the sum of \$573,277. The amounts made up are as follows:-

Increase in members' indemnity, \$214,000.

Senators, \$83,000.

Addition to Prime Minister's salary, \$4,000.

Leader of the opposition, \$7,000. Pensions to ex-ministers who have served a term of five continuous years, \$42,500.

Increase in salary of Judges, \$222, 777.

Total, \$573,277.

The list of ex-cabinet ministers who come within the scope of the benevolence is: Messrs. Tarte, Blair, Sifton, Costigon, Sir Hector Langevin, Sir Charles Tupper, Sir Mackenzie Bowell, Sir Adolphe Caron, Sir C. H. Tupper, Sir John Carling, G. E. Foster, John Haggart.

The sum of \$100,000 was voted in the House of Commons a few days ago for the beginning of the canal between the navigable waters of the Holland River and Newmarket. The whole project will cost over \$300,000. This seems a large expenditure of money in an enterprise the success of which is exceedingly doubtful.

The Globe of Tuesday states that in all probability Sir Richard Cartwright, Mr. Scott and Mr. Fitzpatrick will retire from the Dominion Government about the first of September. The name of Mr. Arch. Campbell, member for Centre York, is freely spoken of as Sir Richard's successor, and Mr. Aylesworth will likely be asked to take the position vacated by the Minister of Justice.

The large increase in the sessional indemnity in the House of Commons is doubtless more popular with the members on both sides of the House than it is with the country. It is true that Parliament has been in session about six months, but the amount of practical business done during that time does not justify the increase. The ratepayers cannot be blamed for favoring shorter speeches, and salaries in proportion.
