

RICHMOND HILL, July 27, 1905

Lord Roberts created somewhat of a sensation in the House of Lords the other day when he declared it his opinion as a practical soldier that the military force of Great Britain was inadequate, imperfectly trained, and totally unfit to uphold the nation as a first-class power. He said that the lessons of the South African war had already been forgotten, and that Britain was as unprepared now as she had shown herself at the beginning of that conflict. Lord Roberts blamed the people, who, he declared, showed no national feeling towards the military till danger arose. And he saw no remedy for the present state of affairs but conscription, or some practical system of universal training.

A gentleman in this vicinity who takes a pride in his garden and orchard, has made inquiries relative to the better prevention of Black Knot on fruit trees. He will find the necessary information in the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1897, Vol. II., chapter 280, page 3238.

Sec. 2 states that "It shall be the duty of every occupant of land, or if the land be unoccupied it shall be the duty of the owner, to cut out and burn all black knot found on plum or cherry trees on his land so often each year as it appears on such trees."

By Sec. 3 the council of any municipality may, and upon a petition of fifteen or more ratepayers shall, by law appoint at least one inspector to enforce the provisions of the Act, etc.

A fine of not less than \$5 and not more than \$20 is provided for in Section 7 of the Act.

The Toronto Globe is about as fair as any of the city papers in discussing the Radial Railway question, but that is not saying very much. Yesterday the Globe said:—"Toronto wants the Radials to come to the market and is willing to grant them the most liberal running rights, so long as these rights can in no way be used to secure an extension of the present street railway franchise." The Globe could have said in other words that the Radials would be allowed to erect the necessary terminals and would be given running rights for 16 years, at the end of which time Toronto could stop the cars altogether. What the Radials ask is that an extension of running rights will be guaranteed them, the price to be settled by arbitration at the end of 16 years.
