The officers of the Ontario Vegetable Growers' Association have instructed the secretary to make arrangements for a committee representing the vegetable growers of the Province to appear before the Tariff Commission when it meets in Toronto, to give evidence on behalf of the vegetable growers. Every year great quantities of vegetables are shipped to the leading cities in Canada from the United States, and often sold at prices below the cost of production at the centres where they are disposed of. The United States tariff prevents Canadian growers shipping their vegetables to the leading cities in the United States when their mar, kets are favorable.


