The Government returns show a reduction of 160 liquor licenses this year. This is an indication that public opinion is decidedly opposed to the traffic.

Japan and Russia have agreed to an exchange of prisoners. By the proposition 1,866 Japanese prisoners will be delivered to their friends, and 64,000 Russians will be given in exchange. The above figures are an indication of the relative success of the two nations in the late bloody war. It will be seen that for every 34 Russians taken as prisoners only 1 Japanese was captured.

The Inland Revenue Department has compiled tables showing the per capita consumption in Canada last fiscal year of spirits, beers, wines, and tobacco. The result shows 1,031 gallons of spirits per head of population; 4,972 gallons of beer; 1,090 gallons of wine, and 2,686 pounds of tobacco.
