RICHMOND HILL, November 16, 1905

For months past the Tory papers of Toronto endeavored to make the people of this province believe that the school clauses in the Autonomy Bill were an outrage on the inhabitants of the new provinces in the Northwest, and that the electors were eagerly waiting to show their disapproval on the first opportunity. An opportunity presented itself last Thursday when the first general election was held for the new Province of Alberta. The result was at most a clean sweep for the Liberal Government, who carried twenty or twenty-one seats out of twenty-five. The Conservatives carried only three seats, and their leader, Mr. Bennett, was among the fallen. If the result is a victory for coercionists, it at least goes to show that the people of Alberta must like to be coerced. They had the votes in their own hands.

A horrible rumor was in circulation on Saturday that The World itself is a corporation, and has more than once had to employ a lawyer to defend its property and fame. Where did it find a public enemy to undertake the job?—Globe.

A somewhat novel meeting was held in a Jewish synagogue in Toronto last Sunday. It was presided over in turn by Mayor Urquhart and Premier Whitney, and the main object was to raise a fund for the relief of distressed survivors of the horrible massacres of Jews at different places in Russia. Care was taken not to excite the feelings of those present, but a resolution was carried requesting King Edward to join in a movement in an endeavor to put a stop to the horrible butchery carried on by the Russians. The citizens of Toronto certainly met in a good cause.

Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, the newly appointed Postmaster-General, who is the Liberal standard-bearer in North York, is being attacked by his opponents, not only because he is a lawyer, but more particularly because he is a lawyer of high standing. Were he a second-rate lawyer he might escape some of the abuse that is now being showered upon him. A story is told of a lawyer who was some time ago a candidate in an election campaign in one of the states across the lines. His friends were forced to admit that he was a member of the legal profession, but their plea was that "he was not much of a lawyer." Mr. Aylesworth's friends in North York stand at a greater disadvantage than the American electors. They know that their candidate is one of the foremost lawyers in the Dominion.
