BY-LAW NO. ---

A By-law to Prohibit the Sale of Liquor in the Municipality of the Township of Vaughan.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Vaughan hereby enacts as follows:

1.—That the sale by retail of spirituous, fermented, or other manufactured liquors is and shall be prohibited in every tavern, inn or other place of public entertainment in the said municipality, and the sale thereof, except by wholesale, is and shall be prohibited in every shop or place in the said municipality other than a house of public entertainment.

2.—That the vote of the electors of the said Township of Vaughan will be taken on the by-law by the deputy-returning officers hereinafter named on MONDAY, the FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Six, commencing at nine o'clock in the morning and continuing till five o'clock in the afternoon at the under-mentioned places:

Polling Sub-Division No. 1, Victoria Hall, Thornhill, William M. Bowes, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 2, John Charles House, Patterson, William S. Rumble, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 3, Temperance Hall, Edgely, William P. Kinnee, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 4, Masonic Hall, Maple, Joshua J. Kaiser, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 5, Mrs. Wiggins' shop, Pine Grove, John Hogg, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 6, Temperance Hall, Purpleville, Roger Harvey, Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 7, Mrs. Fleming's house, Lot 15, Con. 9, William Wood, jr., Deputy Returning Officer.

Polling Sub-Division No. 8, Lankins' shop, Klemburg, George Kellam, Deputy Returning Officer.

3.—That on the TWENTY-EIGHTH DAY OF DECEMBER, A. D. 1905, at the Clerk's Office in the Village of Maple at the hour of Two o'clock in the afternoon, the reeve shall appoint in writing, signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the clerk, and one person to attend at each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this by-law, and a like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this by-law.

4.—That the Clerk of the said Municipal Council of the Township of Vaughan shall attend at the Township Hall, Vellore, at the hour of Ten o'clock in the forenoon on the SECOND DAY OF JANUARY, A. D. 1906, to sum up the number of votes given for and against this By-law.

5.—This By-law shall come into operation, and be of full force and effect on and after the first day of May next after the final passing thereof.
