Holders of worn Canadian silver currency, who have found difficulty in passing it, will be glad to learn that the Dominion Government contemplate legislation providing for the redemption of worn silver, the cost of recoining which is small.

The new liquor law introduced by the Ontario Government gives a hard blow to Local Option. At present all that is necessary is a bare majority vote. By the proposed law a municipality casting 200 ballots would require to have a majority of 40 before the by-law would be carried.

Mr. W. F. Maclean, M. P., has introduced a bill in Parliament to repeal chapter 30 of the statutes of 1905, intitled an act respecting anuities for certain Privy Councillors, and chapter 43 of the statutes of 1905, intitled an act to amend the act respecting the Senate and House of Commons. The bill is designed to repeal the legislation of last session dealing with the indemnity and pensions.

In Parliament on Monday, Sir Wilfrid Laurier stated that the Government of Newfoundland were aware that the Dominion Government were ready at any time to take up the subject of the island colony coming into confederation, and Hon. Wm. Patterson stated that representations by an agent of the German Government, with a view to improving trade relations between Canada and Germany, will be taken into consideration in revising the tariff.

Mr. Arch. Campbell, M. P., has introduced a bill in the Dominion Parliament providing that when milk is sold by the can eight gallons shall constitute a can, and four gallons a half can.

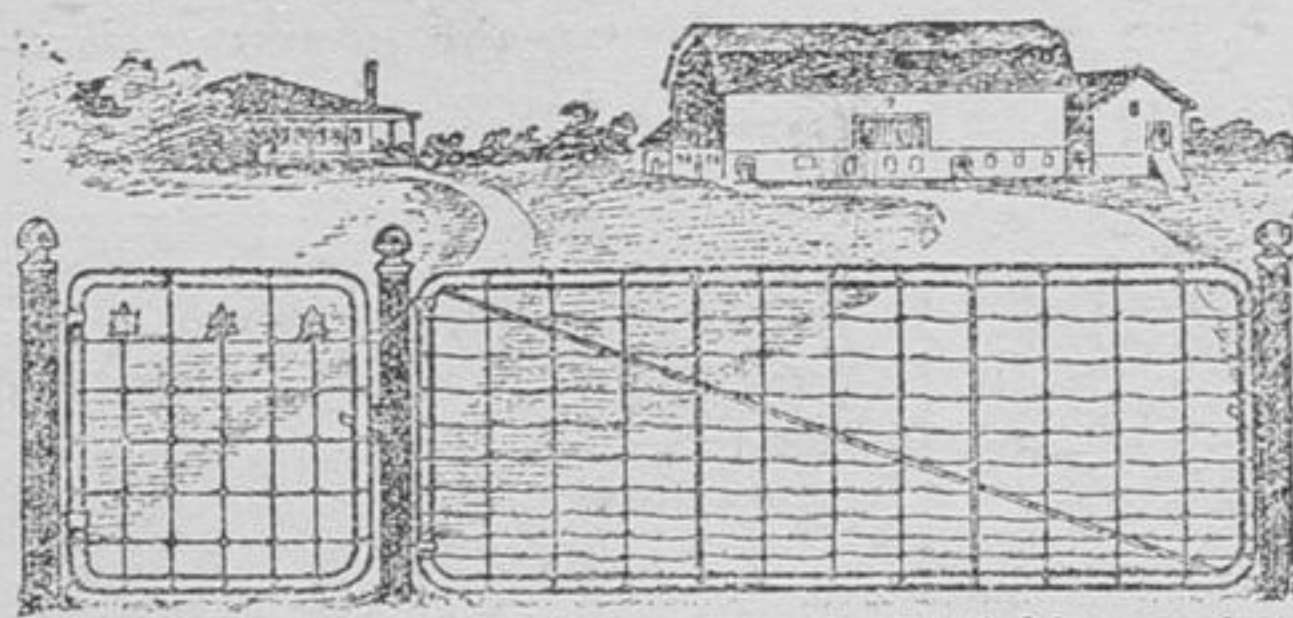
It is to be hoped in the interests of the farmers that the bill will pass. It is estimated that from 2,500 to 3,000 cans of milk are shipped to Toronto daily, and it is all sold at a certain price per can. A can at the present time is supposed to contain just eight gallons, but as the cans are supplied by City dealers, it is claimed they are often made to hold 8½ and 8¾ gallons. This is a loss to the farmer who is docked if every can is not full. If Mr. Campbell's bill become law a standard will be fixed and the present injustice overcome.

A petition is being circulated throughout the North York School Inspectorate to be presented to the Warden and members of the County Council, intimating that in the opinion of the petitioners, the County Council did not give due consideration relative to the retirement of Mr. A. B. Davidson, the School Inspector. The petitioners claim that the charges against the gentleman holding such a responsible position should be carefully investigated, and request that the matter be re-opened, and charges formulated. The petitioners also ask that all persons concerned be given full opportunity of being heard for and against such charges, and that if the charges are not proven the Inspector be reinstated in his position.

The following is section 1 of Hon. Mr. Montiegh's bill now before the Ontario Legislature, respecting County Councils:—

In and for the year 1907 and thereafter the council of every county or union of counties in this Province shall be constituted as follows:

1. Every town not separated from the county for municipal purposes and every township and village shall be represented in such council by the reeve of such town, township

or village municipality, and, in addition to the reeve, by a deputy reeve or deputy reeves as follows:

(a) If the municipality had the names of more than 1,000 and not more than 2,000 persons on the last revised voters' list of the municipality as qualified to vote at municipal elections, then by a first deputy reeve,

(b) If the municipality had more than 2,000 and not more than 3,000 such names upon such list, then by a first deputy reeve and a second deputy reeve, and

(c) If the municipality had more than 3,000 such names upon such list then by a first deputy reeve, a second deputy reeve, and a third deputy reeve.

The Government's Liquor Act just introduced by Hon. Mr. Hanna makes a number of radical changes.

The following are some of the new provisions:—

Regulations to be uniform throughout the Province.

Bartenders in cities and towns to be licensed.

Third offence by licensee to cancel license.

Radical increase in license fee in all municipalities. In cities of over 100,000 to be \$1,200 for tavern, and \$1,000 for shop licenses; towns, \$350; villages, \$250; townships, \$120.

Votes for local option by-laws to be taken on annual municipal election days, and to be compulsory on petition of 25 per cent. of voters.

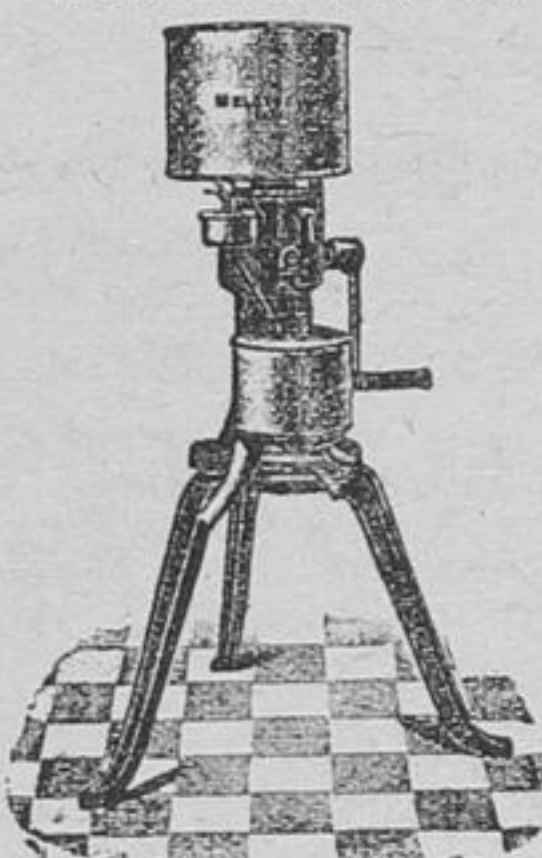
Three-fifths of vote polled to carry local option by-law, and three-fifths of vote necessary to repeal it. To be in force for two years, at least, if carried.

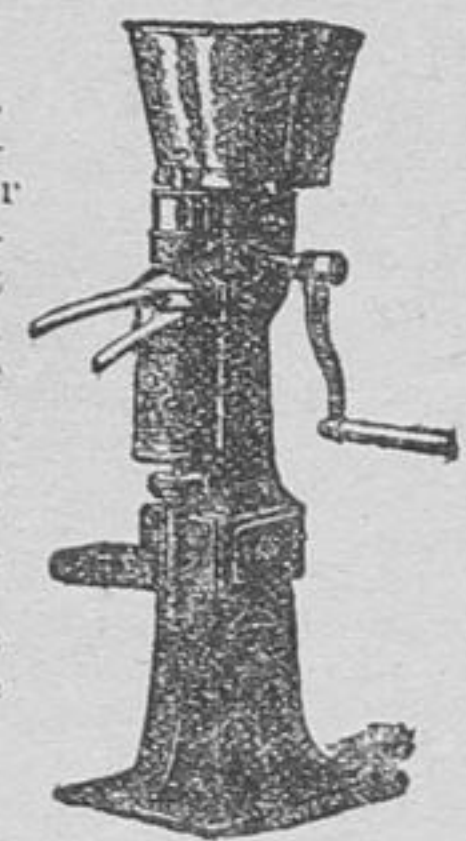
