Victoria Day At Richmond Hill A Successful Fair

LARGE ATTENDANCE

Although the receipts show that the crowd at the Fair on the 24th was not as large as it was a year before, nevertheless the number that passed through the gates was large, and on the whole, probably, Richmond Hill never enjoyed a more successful day. The weather was ideal, and the park with its green swards never looked more beautiful than on Thursday last. The speeding track was in excellent condition, and the wonder is that more fast horses did not enter for the \$200 purse offered for the free-for-all trot. As there was only one entry in that class the race was abandoned, but Mr. N. W. Vadden's Velma accompanied by a running mate gave a good exhibition of speeding in three heats which proved interesting to the spectators. The managers of the ice cream and candy booths were kept busy, and the merry-go-round did a good trade.

The exhibits in most of the department were creditable. Seldom has a finer display of horses been seen in a show ground outside of large cities. There were not so many entries in the cattle, sheep and swine departments, but poultry made a good showing. Besides the ladies' work in the Hall, Mr. Pethick had a collection of graphophones and sewing machines, Mr. A. G. Savage a Karn piano, Mr. Hulse a Heintzman piano, Mr. Hill a cream separator. There was likewise a good display of wagons, buggies, etc., from Trench's Carriage Works.

Three teams took part in the football tournament which commenced shortly after 11 o'clock. The teams were Toronto, Scarborough Heathers and Aurora. The last named drew the bye, and in the first match Toronto defeated the Heathers. In the afternoon Aurora defeated Toronto and won the \$22 prize.
