MARKHAM TOWNSHIP COUNCIL.

Council met May 26, at 11 a. m. All the members present, Reeve Slater in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

Communications were received from the following:—Donald R. Beaton, Clerk of Pickering Township, re. grant on East Townline; W. A. Clark, Clerk York Township, re. grant on South Townline; W. John Spring, re. rent of pasture on roadway; W. G. Boynton, Eli Hoover, Hugh Canning, James Maxwell, Fred Elliott, R. G. Francy, Geo. Robinson, C. P. Reid, A. B. Coulson, Joseph Grove, declining to act as road overseers; James Bay Railway Company, re. interest on taxes.

Padget—Nigh—That the treasurer pay Jos. Blanchard, per John Duncan, the sum of \$6, for clearing out ditch between lots 15 and 16, con. 1.—Carried.

Hagerman—Lapp—That the Council do and now resolve itself into a Court of Revision, to hear appeals against assessments of 1903.—Carried.

The following changes were made:—Fred Rattle's assessment lowered \$100; H. Hoover, dog struck off; E. R. Thomas, dog struck off. West Half: David Jones, reduced \$150; E. A. Sloane, reduced \$200; R. S. & J. A. Thomson, reduced \$100; Stuart Wilcox, dismissed; Bethesda & Stouffville Telephone Co., struck off; Markham Baking Telephone Co., struck off; A. J. Thomson, struck off; Wm. Russell, reduced \$400; James Russell, reduced \$100; John Duncan, reduced \$200; J. G. Alcombrac, reduced \$100; Robert Gee, reduced \$100.

Lapp—Padget—That the assessment rolls for the year 1903, as finally revised by the Court of Revision, be and the same are hereby confirmed.—Carried.

Hagerman—Lapp—That the council give a grant of \$150, to be expended on Hagerman's Hill on 6th con.—Carried. Nigh—Padget—That the sum of \$125 be granted to improve North Townline, on condition that Whitechurch grant a like amount.—Carried.

Lapp—Hagerman—That Mr. Nigh be commissioner to repair culvert on course opposite lot 21, con. 6, and to take what action he may deem necessary.—Carried.

Nigh—Padget—that the mover be appointed commissioner to put in culvert between lots 30 and 31, con. 6.—Carried.

Lapp—Hagerman—That the mover be commissioner to repair culvert on sideline between lots 20 and 21, con. 8.—Carried.

Padget—Nigh—That the mover be a commissioner to repair culvert between lots 30 and 31, con. 4.—Carried.

Padget—Nigh—That the sum of one hundred dollars be granted towards cement sidewalks in Div. No. 55 north on condition the carriage raise a similar amount.—Carried.

Hagerman—Nigh—That Hagerman and Lapp be commissioners to get Iron Bridges painted in the township that they think necessary.

Padget—Nigh—That the sum of fifty dollars be granted to improve the East Townline and south of the Locust Hill sideline.

Hagerman—Nigh—That the Reeve and Lapp be commissioners to repair road injured by landslide on sideline between lots 5 and 6 in the 8 con.—Carried.

Lapp—Hagerman—That the clerk notify the Township of Scarborough that the Township of Markham intend spending an amount not exceeding \$25,000 in improving the South Townline at foot of the tenth concession and request them to appoint a commissioner to act in conjunction with Mr. Joseph Lapp in expending the same.—Carried.

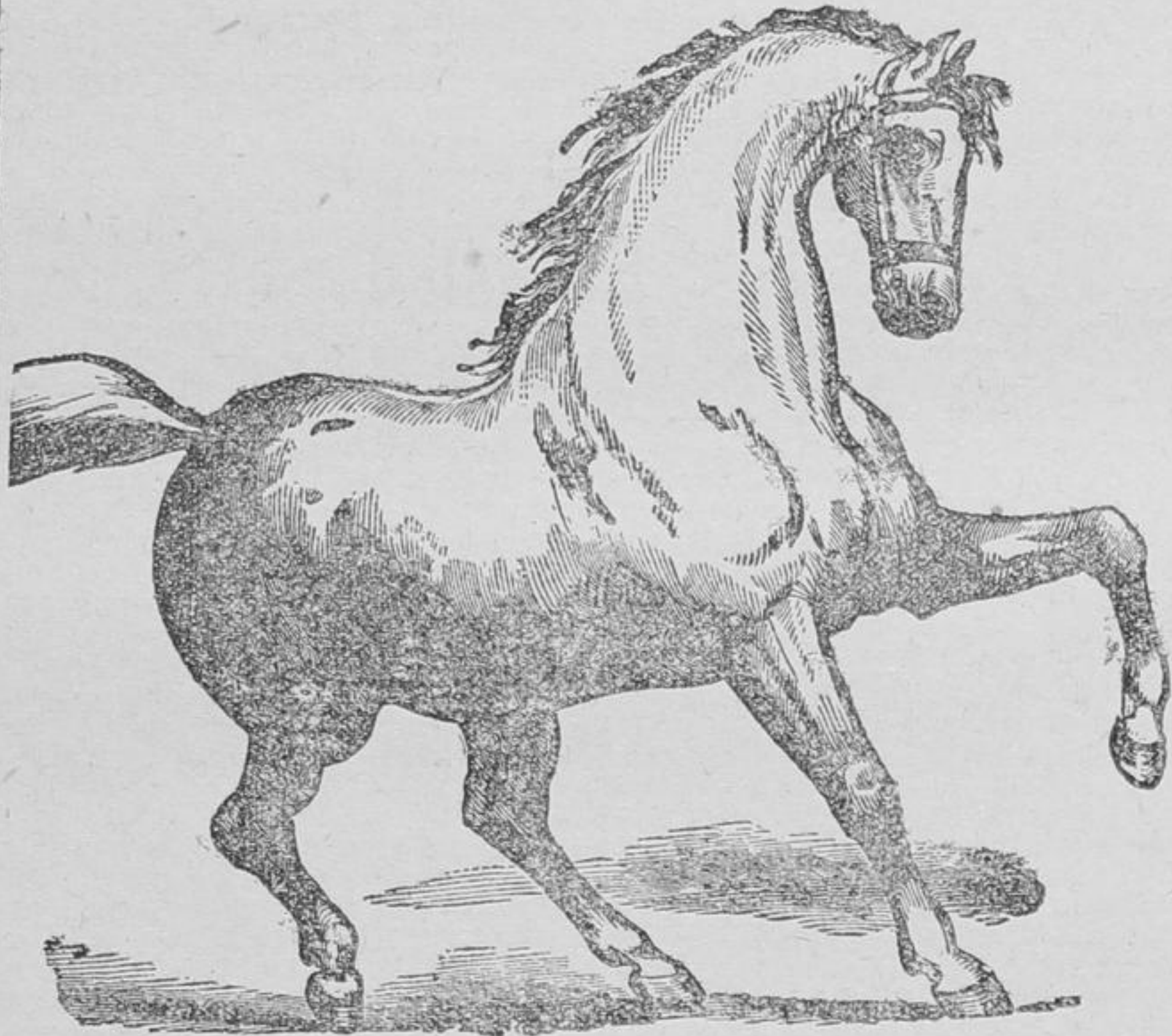
