McNair—That councillors Longhouse and Devis be a committee to interview the ratepayers over and through whose lands the C. P. R. now runs as to proposed changes of route of said C. P. R., and as to the advisability of leaving the old grade of road best as a township highway, and report to the clerk forthwith.—Carried.

Devis—Longhouse—that by-law No. 817, re-closing Shaver Road, do now receive its third and final reading. Yeas—Devis, Longhouse, Cameron Nays—McNair, Boyle. Carried.

Cameron—Longhouse—that the clerk be instructed to notify Mr. W. H. Grant, barrister, to put in a defence against a writ issued re Shaver Road. Carried.

The council then adjourned to meet Tuesday, August 14 at 1 p.m.

News Notes.

Normal schools are to be established at Peterboro', Stratford, Hamilton and North Bay.

Dr. Maurice Hutton has been appointed acting President of the University of Toronto, in place of Dr. Loudon resigned.

In a duel with swords following the rote on the Dreyfus vindication, the French Under Secretary of State was seriously wounded.

Dr. McLellan who for a number of years past has been principal of the Normal College at Hamilton, has resigned. Mr. Thompson, B.A. who was vice-principal under Dr. McLellan becomes acting principal until a permanent successor is appointed.

A despatch relating to the Western Harvest says:—Weather conditions continue most favorable. The crop will be a week or ten days earlier than last year and cutting will commence in about four weeks. Everything points to a magnificent yield.

The citizens of Newmarket hope to secure the Pickering College in their town. The town has offered a bonus, electric light and water free for a period of ten years to the extent of \$600 annually, and supplemented by a subscription of \$15,000 indubment for the rebuilding of the college there.

Government officials are making a new survey for the construction of a new Welland Canal. It is said that a good portion of the old Welland Canal, now hardly used at all, will be utilized. This will be a decided advantage to the City of St. Catharines. The new canal will be 24 feet in depth, deep enough for the largest boats.

Is Disease a Crime?
