DOMESTIC RECIPES.

Vegetable Cutlets. - Delightful vegeone onion and fry golden brown in a tablespoonful of butter. Boil and chop fine new carrots and white turnips to make one heaping cupful of each, add these and the onion to the potato, season very highly with salt and pepper, add a tablespoonful of chopped parsley and mould into small cutlets. Dip each in slightly beaten egg, roll in fine bread crumbs, and fry golden brown in deep, smoking hot fat.

WHEAT MOTOR TIRES.

Inventor Discovers Substitute for Rubber Made From Cereals.

A new substitute for rubber has been found, and if the claims of a Middlesex (England) inventor proves to be well founded, we shall some day see motor cars and bicycles with tires made of wheat, golf balls that once were kernels of maize, pavements of barley, and linoleum that might have been rye bread.

Patent office records show that some 300 inventions of substitutes for rubber have been filed, not one of which has attained success.

The new claimant is Mr. William Thredfall Carr, of Wembley. He purposes to make artificial rubber from cereals. It is said that a syndicate of capitalists interested in the manufacturing have offered him \$1,250.000 for his patent

rights. The invention of artificial rubber was prophesied at the recent meeting of the British Association, and the industrial world has been eager for it ever since the motor car and bicycle trades threatened to exhaust the supply of the

natural article.

Mr. Carr's substitute is obtained by treating any cereal with phyalin, a well-known chemical substance that acts in solution as a ferment, turning the starchy matter in grain into dextrose. Another chemical is used in the process to check fermentation at any desired stage. This makes it possible to produce the artificial rubber in several different strengths.
