BIBLE SOCIETY MEETING

The annual meeting of the Richmond Hill Branch of the Upper Canada Bible Society was held in the basement of the Presbyterian church on Friday evening. There was a larger attendance than usual, and had our citizens generally known beforehand the nature of the programme it is safe to say the place would have been crowded. Rev. W. E. Hassard, B. A., B.D., field secretary, gave an able address on the work of the Bible Society, and illustrated his remarks with lantern slides, 79 different pictures being thrown on a canvas. The address was interesting and helpful, and the views were very distinct. The first thrown on the canvas was that of Mary Jones who is said to have been the originator of the Bible Society when only ten years of age. Mr. Hassard impressed upon his hearers the importance of the work, and stated that during last year in Winnipeg alone the scriptures were supplied to the inhabitants in 43 different tongues, and at prices within the reach of the poorest. Rev. J. A. Grant, M. A., who acted as chairman, also made some appropriate remarks. At the close of the address Mr. Hassard was accorded a hearty vote of thanks on motion of Mr. J. H. Sanderson, seconded by Mr. Andrew Newton. A report showed that there were bibles and testaments in the depository to the amount of \$33.65, and that the sales since last audit had been \$6.75.
