Application to Parliament.

Take notice that an application will be made to the Legislature of the Province of Ontario at its next Session, for an Act to incorporate a Company to be known as "The Artesian Water Co., Limited," with power to survey lands in any part or parts of the County of York; to sink wells or tunnels; to dig trenches in or through private or public property; to lay or sink pipes or mains; to convey water in and through such pipes from or to any point or points in the County of York; to examine such wells, tunnels, trenches and pipes and keep them in repair or to take up same; to erect buildings, machinery, standpipes and reservoirs for the purposes of the Company; and build any plant necessary to properly carry out the business of the Company; to sell such water to individuals, firms, corporations public and private, and municipal corporations; to expropriate, purchase or otherwise acquire land or lands required for the foregoing purposes; to enter into contracts for the supply of water to the Municipal Corporations of the Villages of Richmond Hill, Markham and Weston; of the towns of North Toronto and Toronto Junction, and of the Townships of Whitechurch, Markham, Vaughan and York respectively for fire service and domestic use for a period of twenty years or upwards, and for such further rights and powers as may be deemed necessary to the proper and legal carrying out of the business of the Company.
