

As the village is situated in an out-of-the-way corner of the Grand Duchy, the chance of the desired total being made up in an odd visitor or two and a few tramps, was considered extremely remote, and the burgomaster was in despair. In the nick of time, however, a band of gipsies arrived, who brought up the total to 1,004. DEEPEST MINERAL BORE.

What is believed to be the deepest and most successful coal bore in Great Britain, if not, indeed, in the world, is that which has been sunk and is nearing completion in the neighborhood of Cameron Bridge, Fife, Scotland. The bore has reached the enormous depth of 4.000ft. At that distance from the surface the Dunfermline splint coal, a seam of splendid mineral, has been probed. How far in the future it will be before it is commercially expedient to work coal at such a depth is a problem which only mining engineers can solve.

PAPER GAS PIPES.

Gas-pipes of paper are being made in France. Manila paper is cut in strips equal to the length of the pipes to be made. These are then placed in a receiver filled with melted asphalt and wrapped around a core of iron until the desired thickness is reached. After being submitted to strong pressure the paper is coated with sand, cooled, the cere withdrawn, and the outer pipe surface covered with a waterproof preparation. It is claimed that these pipes are as good as, and more economical than, metal ones.
