

MARKHAM TOWNSHIP COUNCIL.

According to statute the council met at 11 o'clock on Monday. The clerk administered the declaration of office and qualification and the members took their seats as follows:—

Reeve, Jonathan Slater; Deputy-Reeve, W. H. Lapp; Councillors, Jonathan Nigh, Geo. B. Padget and Geo. C. Morrison.

Applications were received from Marussah R. Fretz and Elijah Wismer for the position of assessor for the east half of the township, and from Wm. Brown for the west half.

A communication was read from K. V. McKay, Sec. Ontario Municipal Association, asking council to petition the Legislature through the member for the riding, to relieve municipalities of heavy responsibility where injuries are incurred through non-repair of highways, and to repeal Sec. 606 of the Municipal Act.

Nigh—Padget—That the following dog tax be refunded, being wrongfully assessed:—Geo. Gormley, one dog and one bitch, \$3; Chris. Hagerman, one dog, \$1; John Hemmingway, two dogs, \$2; Mr. J. Thomson, Samuel Miller, Jas. Sheppard and Jos. Wideman, one dog each.

M. Thos. Hagerman, reported having seen N. Ogden and W. H. Stiver, and claims for damages to their horses through getting hurt by getting a foot through hole in culvert in 5th con., lot 20 and 14. Each Wanted \$10 damages.

Padget—Nigh—That the treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the Robinson Bros. \$3 for cutting thistles and noxious weeds on Canadian Northern Railway, situate in road 11v, No. 2 east Markham, and that the clerk forward account to Railway Co. for payment, and if refused that he enter the account in court for collection.

A number of general accounts were paid.

The collectors were relieved from taxes amounting to \$7,475.84.

Lapp—Morrison—That the clerk be authorized to pay each deputy-returning officer the sum of \$3 and mileage, each poll clerk \$2 each constable \$1 and for each polling booth \$3.

Nigh—Padget—That Mr. Morrison be commissioner to repair culvert opp. lots 20, con. 8, also to repair bridge between lots 25 and 26, con. 7; amount payable on his order when completed.

Morrison—Lapp—That Mr. Padget and Mr. Winch be commissioners to prospect for gravel on lot 18, con. 2.

Padget—Nigh—That the clerk be authorized to procure six copies of Municipal World for 1907.

A by-law was passed appointing Wm. Brown assessor for West half and Elijah Wismer for east half, and Jno. F. Davison and Walter Scott, auditors.

A by-law was passed providing for the maintenance of the Township roads between Markham and Vaughan and to define his duties. J. E. Francis was appointed commissioner at \$25 and \$800's a part for maintenance.

A by-law was passed appointing Wm. Monkman, J. A. Mitchell and David James a board of health in conjunction with the reeve and clerk, and Robert Campbell sanitary inspector at \$2.00 a day and 5c. per mile mileage.

Lapp—Padget—That the mover and Mr. Morrison be a committee on printing and report at next meeting.

Nigh—Morrison—That Mr. Padget be appointed commissioner to repair stone crusher ready for use in spring.

Nigh—Padget—That a grant of \$10 be made to the Sick Children's Hospital and authorized the treasurer to pay the same.

A resolution was passed that the council meet on the second Saturday in each month during the year, excepting days fixed by statute.

The Reeve and Nigh and Padget were appointed a committee on finance.

Nigh—Padget—That we allow the collectors \$38 each for extra work in collecting taxes.

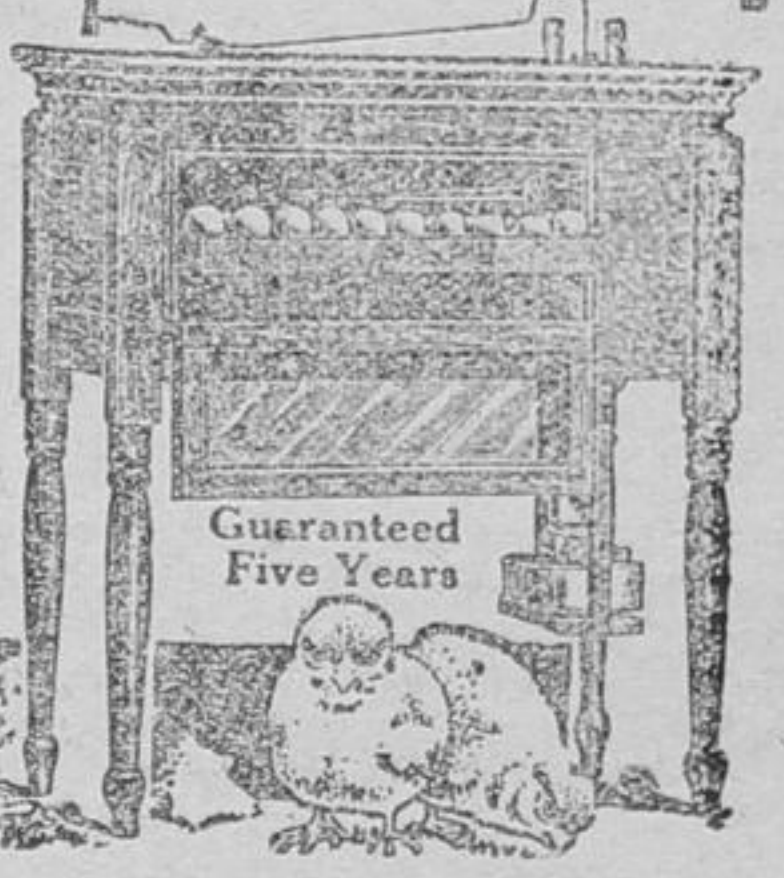
