

Growth of Traffic is Enormous-2,236, 000,000 Passengers in 1906.

The remarkable growth of tramway traffic in the United Kingdom is indiated in a return issued by the Board of Trade. The following figures show the extent of the progress made since 1887:

Miles of route, 1887, 269; 1906, 2,240. Passengers, 1878, 146,000,000; 1906, 2. 236.000,000. Net receipts, 1878, £230,-956; 1906, £3 807,415. Capital expenditure, 1878, £4,207,350; 1906, £58,177,832. The popularity of electric traction, toth overhead and conduit, may be gauged from the fact that of the total number of miles open only 246 are not worked by electricity.

Local authorities owning and working their tramway undertakings made a net profit of £2,520,752 on last year's traffic, out of which they applied £663,366 towards the reduction of tramway debt and £205 981 in relief of rates, while carrying £623,617 to reserve and renew-

TREES THAT WHISTLE.

The musical tree that grows in the West India Islands has a leaf of peculiar shape, and pods with split or open edges. The wind passing through these creates the sound which gives the tree its name. In Barbadoes there is a valley filled with these plants, and when the trade winds blow across the island a constant moaning, deep-toned whistle is heard, which, in the still hours of the night, has a weird and unpleasant effect. A species of acacia, growing abundantly in the Soudan, is also called by the same name. Its shoots are frequently, by the agency of the larvae of the forest insects, distorted in shape, and swollen into a globular bladder, from one to two inches in diameter. After the insect has emerged from a little circular hole in the side of the swelling, the opening, played upon by the wind, becomes a musical instrument, equal in sound to a sweet-toned flute.
