STATISTICS OF TRADE.

Show Britain's Immense Superiority—Per Capita Comparison.

Mr. Lloyd-George, in answer to a question put by Mr. Dundas-White, has compared England's trade in 1906 with that of the United States, France and Germany in a singularly instructive form.

The foreign trade of the United Kingdom per head of the population was last year equivalent to £20 11s. 7d.; in the United States it was £7 11s. 11d.; in France £10 8s. 7d.; and in Germany £11 7s. 10d. per head.

For home consumption the imports per head of the population of the United Kingdom was £11 9s. 6d.; in the United States £3 4s. 2d.; in France £5 6s. 2d.; and in Germany £6 8s. per head.

"Well, that's nothing," retorted the physician. "I never went to law in my life, and I'm as rich as any two dozen of your clients put together."

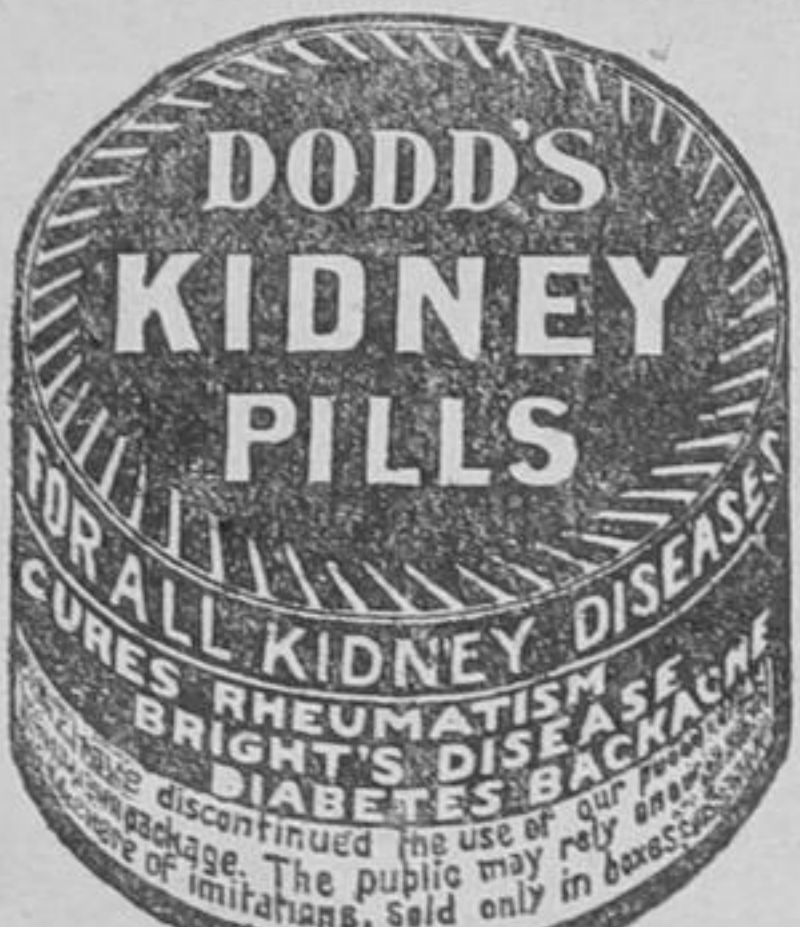

NEW ARTILLERY GUNS.

Since November 30 last, three more batteries of Royal Horse Artillery have received the 13-pounder quick-firing gun, which leaves five batteries of the seventeen under War Office control to receive the new equipment. The five batteries of horse artillery still armed with the obsolete gun are those at Dorchester and Christchurch in the United Kingdom, two in South Africa, and the battery at Cairo. Of the Royal Field Artillery, fifteen batteries have received the 18-pounder quick-firing gun since November 30, making a total of fifty-one batteries now in receipt of the new weapon.

A SCHOOL OF DUELLING.

Frenchmen Taught How to Behave on the Field of Honor.

Although duelling has long been laughed out of court in this country, our Continental friends by no means share our opinion of this method of settling affairs of honor.

Though the French duel is usually carried through without any serious injury to either combatant, it is regarded with grave consideration, and every detail has to be attended to most punctiliously.

In order that gentlemen who may be called upon to defend themselves at the point of the pistol may have some training for the ordeal, says the Wide World Magazine, there has been established in Paris a school for duelling, one prominent member being ex-President Casimir-Perier.

This academy is conducted by Dr. de Villers, and combats freely take place there by way of practice. In these mimic duels wire masks are worn to protect the face and bullets made of wax are used, so that no injury may be sustained by the combatants.

In all other respects, however, the conduct of the affair is carried through as on the field of honor, so that when the time comes—if it ever does come—for the scholars to take part in a serious duel they may acquit themselves with credit to themselves and disaster to their adversary—although this latter point is not of much importance.
