

WILL KISSING BE PROHIBITED?

The Osculatory Process Denounced by Scientists as Extremely Dangerous—How the Danger Can be Removed.

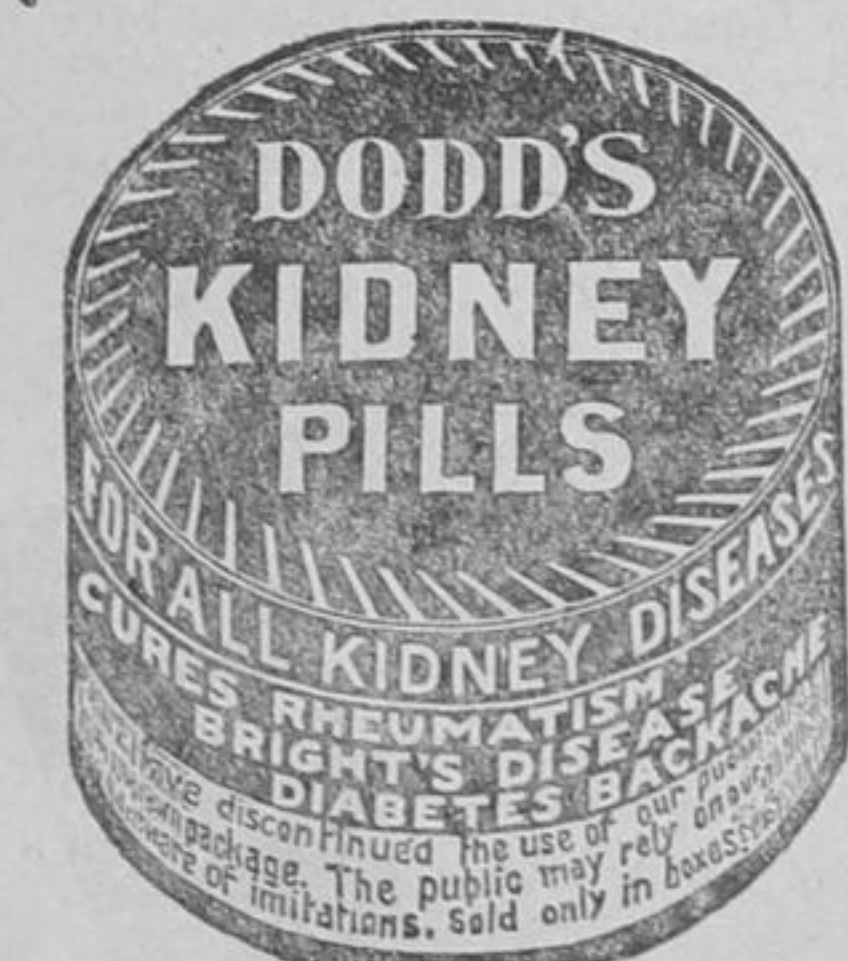

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BURN ASHES, SAVE COAL

THERE IS PLENTY OF HEAT IN YOUR BACKYARD HEAP.

Pennsylvania Shoemaker's Discovery—More Warmth in Ashes Than in Anthracite.

While sitting at his bench eking out a living with hammer and awl, John Ellmore, a cobbler of Altoona, Pennsylvania, for twenty years has been revolving in his brain a problem that he has finally solved to his own satisfaction, and that apparently is destined to revolutionize the question of producing heat. Ellmore says he has discovered a method of making ashes burn, and a practical demonstration has convinced former sceptics. Ellmore not only makes ashes burn and produce heat, but he produces considerably more heat from a given quantity of ashes than can be obtained from the same amount of pure bituminous or anthracite coal. At the plant of the Citizens' Electric Company he the other day was allotted one of ten boilers, and with three bushels of ashes he produced more heat than was obtained from the other nine. This demonstration was witnessed by several hundred persons.

A SIMPLE PROCESS.

Ellmore is carefully guarding his secret, and has applied for patent rights. His process is very simple. He takes ten parts of ashes to one part of coal and over this sprinkles a small quantity of a compound which causes the combustion. He says that for 25 cents sufficient of this compound can be prepared to last an ordinary family one winter, with a coal consumption of less than one ton. In his shop he has used less than half a ton of coal this winter, and he declares that a ton will last him two years.

DISCOVERY NO ACCIDENT.

When he opened the doors of the boiler in which his compound was burning the other day, spectators gazed upon a fire that glowed, brilliantly and had a bluish tinge. A lump of coal was surrounded by ashes and the ashes glowed like a bed of burning anthracite. There was apparently no diminution in the amount of heat during the several hours that the demonstration continued. Ellmore says his discovery was not an accident. His father before him had conceived the possibility of obtaining heat from ashes, but had not lived to demonstrate it.

The younger Ellmore has been experimenting for more than twenty years, and it was about eight months ago that he finally obtained the right solution. Before giving his secret to the world Ellmore demonstrated time and again its practicability, and was satisfied after he had made less than a half ton of coal produce more heat than he heretofore had obtained from ten or fifteen tons of coal that he held probably the greatest discovery that has been made in a century.

CHALEUR BAY'S "FIRE-SHIP."

Absent-Minded Surgeon Left Pair of Forceps in Woman's Body.

A remarkable case of neglect on the part of a hospital surgeon is mentioned in the British Medical Journal. Dr. Stewart, of Midland Junction, West Australia, records the circumstances of the case. He operated on a woman and found a pair of forceps in her body. The forceps were nearly 5 inches in length, and the width across the handles was about 2 inches, and they had been left in the woman's body after an operation ten and a half years before. "That the forceps should have attained the position in which they were found without causing death is extraordinary," Dr. Stewart writes. "Though the patient's health had been wretched during these years, and a large part of the time spent in bed, it is worthy of notice that she had occasionally felt well enough to participate in dances. I have reason to believe that no record of the former operation can be found in the books of the hospital where it was performed."
